Membership Information

The 2019-20 fiscal year brings some new technology changes to BNC for annual membership dues.

**To join our Phoenix chapter as a new member
or to renew your dues, please follow the instructions below.**

The membership fee is \$60 for an individual or \$100 for a couple and covers our fiscal year through June 30, 2020. Here are step-by-step instructions for completing your membership online:

1. [CLICK HERE to go to the BNC membership page](#)
2. Choose your membership level: "**Regular**" or "**Couples**."
3. Under **Designations** you will see "**BNC Annual Membership**" with either \$60 or \$100 pre-selected, depending on what you chose in Step 2.
4. For **BNC Chapter**, scroll the drop-down until you see "**Phoenix**" and select it.
5. Click "**Next**." [Please skip the **Scheduled Payments box**.]
6. Fill in the **Personal Information** fields.
 - a. **Couples:** If husband and wife have the same last name, enter it in the Last Name(s) field. Enter Husband's first name and Wife's first name in the First Name(s) field (e.g., Joe & Ann). If the couple has **different last names**, enter the Husband's full name in the First Name(s) field and enter the Wife's full name in the Last Name(s) field.
 - b. Enter Email address and confirm.
 - c. For **Preferred Class Year**, scroll the drop-down arrow until you see "N/A" and select it (unless you actually attended Brandeis University).
 - d. For **Relationship to Brandeis**, scroll the drop-down arrow until you see "**BNC Member**" and select it.
 - e. Enter at least one Phone Number and additional ones as you prefer.
 - f. Complete the Home Address fields.
 - g. Click "Save and Continue." Or "Back" to edit the previous entries.
7. Fill in the **Billing Information to PAY WITH YOUR CREDIT CARD**.
8. Click "**Next**."
9. Once you see the "**THANK YOU**" page, you're done!

GUESTS WHO ARE BNC MEMBERS

- ◆ BNC members not enrolled in a Study Group may attend any session, space permitting, for a guest fee of \$5 (\$7 for Concerts and Conversations). If the member subsequently joins the group, the guest fee can be applied to the registration fee.

GUESTS WHO ARE NON-MEMBERS

- ◆ People who are not yet BNC members may attend a study group, space permitting, as a *one-time* guest. A \$5 guest fee applies (\$7 for Concerts and Conversations). If the non-member subsequently joins BNC and wishes to join the group, the guest fees paid can be applied to the study group registration fees.

GUEST FEES - COLLECTION

- ◆ Guest fees are paid to the facilitators, either by cash or a check payable to BNC.

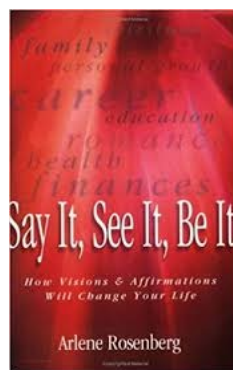

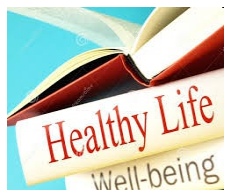

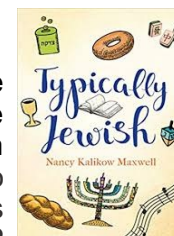
