WEEKLY THOUGHTS THE MOST HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY JUNE 15th, 2025

Dear friends, welcome to the celebration of the Most Holy Trinity Sunday celebrated a week after Pentecost Sunday. On Pentecost Sunday, the Church celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles as promised by Jesus. The Holy Spirit was to teach and remind the disciples Jesus had entrusted the work of bringing the Good News of Salvation as they bore witness to the Resurrection of Jesus.

The celebration of the Most Holy Trinity Sunday is an invitation to reflect on the Three Persons of the Trinity and their role in our salvation. Many times, Jesus spoke of his Father; “the Father loves the Son, and the Son Loves the Father. The Son obeys the Father and always chooses to do the will of the Father.” I can say that the entire Easter Season was a celebration of the victory of the Son over death and sin. Jesus promised all who believe in him to share into his resurrection and a place in his Father’s house.

The Most Holy Trinity is a Mystery, as has been taught by the great teachers in the Church like St Augustine. They speak of the perfect harmony between the Three Persons characterized by a relationship of love and unity. In the Trinity we find the perfect and true love in Jesus – the perfect image of the Father.

The Blessed Trinity is an article of Christian faith as professed in the Creed on Sunday.

May the Spirit of Jesus help us to love, understand and appreciate our limitations getting to know the Blessed Trinity.

Thank you all for your prayers as I am slowly recovering from the cold. Please continue to pray for me and the sick members of our Parish communities.

Next Sunday will celebrate Corpus Christi Sunday. Let’s plan prior arrangements for the celebration of this great Feast and relive the Eucharistic Presence.
