The PNWGS is honored to welcome Dr. Gary Wu as the Annual University of Washington's Wade Volwiler Visiting Professor. Gary D. Wu, MD is the Ferdinand G. Weisbrod Professor in Gastroenterology at the University of Pennsylvania's Perelman School of Medicine. He is the Vice Chief for Research in the Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology, Director of both the NIH P30 Center for Molecular Studies in Digestive and Liver Disease and the Penn Center for Nutritional Science and Medicine as well as the Co-Director of the PennCHOP Microbiome Program. He was the inaugural Director and Chair of the Scientific Advisory Board for the American Gastroenterological Association's Center for Gut Microbiome Research and Education and is an elected member of both the American Society for Clinical Investigation and the Association of American Physicians. Research in the Wu lab currently focuses the impact of diet on the gut microbiome including dietary xenobiotic metabolism.
