

## **Precinct Committeemen**

The office of precinct committeeman is defined in Arizona Revised Statutes (ARS) Section 16, Chapter 5, Article 2. The precinct committeeman is an elected official with responsibilities prescribed by the State and by his political party. Every recognized political party in Arizona has precinct committeemen.

Precinct committeemen are the members of each legislative district party committee. In addition to fulfilling their responsibilities, they vote on the leadership of their county and state committees.

Responsibilities include:

- Voting, in person or by proxy, at each and every district and county party election when qualified to do so. This allows you to elect who leads our legislative districts and county party.
- Assisting the Republican Party in voter registration.
- Assisting and encouraging Republican voters to vote on election days.
- Attending District and County meetings.
- Working within the precinct from which elected.
- Creating enthusiasm and support for the Republican Party.
- Help to elect Republican candidates.
- Foster loyalty to the Republican Party and promote its ideals.
