Winner - Ch.c by Summer Squall-Bali Babe, by Drone. Trained by D. Wayne Lukas; bred in Kentucky by William S. Farish & Parrish Hill Farm. \$1,186,200 - gross value and \$90,000 Gold Cup. Net to winner \$886,200; second \$170,000; third \$85,000; fourth \$45,000.

CHARISMATIC, three wide on the first turn and in reasonable striking position, lodged his bid on the far turn while continuing three wide, gained the lead nearing the sixteenth pole and lasted over MENIFEE. MENIFEE, well back early and four wide on the first turn, began to advance between horses nearing the far turn, sustained his rally while weaving between horses in the stretch and drifting late, finished strongly but ran out of ground. CAT THIEF prompted the pace while racing outside of VALHOL, bid heads apart for the lead while inside WORLDLY MANNER on the far turn, continued to battle for the lead in the stretch only to weaken slightly late. PRIME TIMBER, four wide on the first turn, moved up five wide on the far turn, had a clear shot in the stretch but lacked the needed late kick while being forced out some. EXCELLENT MEETING was well back while saving ground around the first turn, began to pass opponents while three wide and in a bit of traffic on the far turn and finished willingly from the far outside. KIMBERLITE PIPE was steadied and bumped early on the first turn while four wide, continued four wide on the far turn and was carried out some late. WORLDLY MANNER, well positioned just off the leaders and three wide on the first turn, bid for command with CAT THIEF while outside that opponent on the far turn, continued heads apart for the lead to midstretch and tired. K ONE KING was never a factor in the running and was outside in the stretch. LEMON DROP KID trailed in the early stages while five wide on the first turn, also took a five wide path on the far turn and passed tired horses. ANSWER LIVELY, a pace factor from the inside while in tight on the first turn, retreated nearing the stretch. GENERAL CHALLENGE lost early position after breaking slowly and being bumped, checked hard from between horses nearing the first turn, made a mild run six wide around the far turn and was finished after entering the stretch. ECTON PARK was never a factor in the running DESERT HERO, bumped around between horses entering the first turn while in the second flight, checked from between horses late on the far turn while tiring. STEPHEN GOT EVEN gained striking position after being bumped around between horses entering the first turn while racing in the second flight, began to fall back on the backstretch, backed off on the far turn and retreated while racing on the rail in the stretch. VALHOL made the pace under light pressure to midway on the far turn and tired. FIRST AMERICAN broke slowly, made a move into contention on the rail on the backstretch but was finished soon after. ADONIS was bumped at the start, steadied on the rail going into the far turn, went eight wide into the stretch and could not make an impact. VICAR raced wide the entire trip and was finished nearing the stretch. THREE RING ducked in at the start, steadied on the rail early and checked again on the rail on the first turn, and drifted out late while not being abused.
