

## Donations Needed



Dr. Christopher Grills would like to start a Children's bell choir and it would be wonderful to buy the bells and start lessons as soon as possible. Wouldn't it be a wonderful addition to our season of Advent? They're called, Kristal Bells and are a color-coded handbell system designed for children, allowing them to play music without prior musical knowledge by following color-coded

cards alongside orchestrated songs. Of course, adults are welcome to join, also.

A starter set of the bells costs about \$300, and includes 4 boxes of handbells, (8 bells/tones per box in C Major Scale), 2 sets of cue cards (2 songs), 2 CDs (2 songs), and Instructions.

Would you be able to help us raise this money? The sooner, the better. How exciting this will be, and how exciting it is to hear the laughter of children in our church again! Their presence fills the church with such a wonderful energy! If you have children or grandchildren, I bet they'd love to join in playing the bells! The kids will bond and form friendships, and that energy will bring new life to our church community!
