I. One thing we must ask God.

Psalm 27:4 — "One thing I have asked from the Lord, that I shall seek: That I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, To behold the beauty of the Lord And to meditate in His temple."

- A. David wanted to live in the house of the Lord. -- Why?
 - 1. To behold the glory of God's beauty. Revelation 4:2-3
 - 2. To meditate in His temple. (literally means to inquire)
- B. Question: What do you pray for most of all?
- II. One thing we must strive to have.
 - A. Paul sought to have a clear purpose for his life.

Philippians 3:13–14 — "Brethren, I do not regard myself as having laid hold of it yet; but one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

- 1. We must continually reach for what lies ahead for us in Christ.
- 2. We must press on toward the goal of getting the prize:
- B. Paul did not let his past set the course of his future and his purpose.
 - 1. He knew he could not dwell on his mistakes and failure.
 - 2. He had to move forward in obedience to Christ.
