Aloha Kakou,

Last Sunday I asked you, "What cross is Jesus asking you to take up as you follow him?" I didn't unpack it much because we were using a Celtic Service of Word and Communion that required a wee bit of explanation in lieu of a sermon. I liked that service as a little changeup from the hymnal settings. If you like, we might use that once in a while.

So, as we move further into Lent, a time of reflection on the death of Jesus, I ask you here again, "What cross is Jesus asking you to take up as you follow him?" That is a more specifically Christian way of asking yourself, "What matters most? What is essential to my life and the lives of those nearest and dearest – family, church, community, nation, and even globally?"

Okay, that can get way too big and abstract – so, let's follow the advice of that bumper sticker one still occasionally sees – "Think Globally, Act Locally." As we consider the Big Problems – climate catastrophe, food refugees, terrorism, and the rise of authoritarianism – what local crosses, what small movements against destruction, can we take up as we prayerfully and contemplatively ask what it means to follow Jesus on the Way of the Cross.

I can think of a few for me and a few for us. Professionally, I am constantly trying to understand the "theology of the cross," which is what the last few paragraphs have touched upon. I am also working on understanding complexity and radical uncertainty as aspects of congregational and community life.

Finally, I am pondering "intersectionality," a term I first read about a few years ago that refers to the connections between discriminations – racism, sexism, ageism, classism, and heterosexism (homophobia), to name just a few. Drilling down further to our little two acres here on the corner of Meheula Parkway and Lanikuhana Avenue, how can we reach out to our Central Oahu community, with food, comfort, and spiritual support in bodied, fleshly ways? How can we offer a worship meal as well as substantive meal services? What about this great new community garden that has been constructed by our local Scouts and volunteers? What about Sunday morning worship? How about the bimonthly IHS supports that we support? What other crosses, hard work, challenging tasks in which we love God by loving our neighbors, including some of the least lovable? How do we care for our loved ones and families in pandemic times and depressed economies?

Tough questions, one and all. Lent is the time for such questions. So I invite you to continue with me through March and on into Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter (April 4th). May the Holy Spirit of the Crucified One encourage us as we take up those crosses and follow Jesus.

- Discussed adding new members to Church Council as some hold-overs from 2020 have now exceeded their time limits.





After months of delays partially due to the pandemic, work began on Monday, February 22, with <u>huge</u> equipment brought in to dig a 23' hole.
