Stain Glass Windows

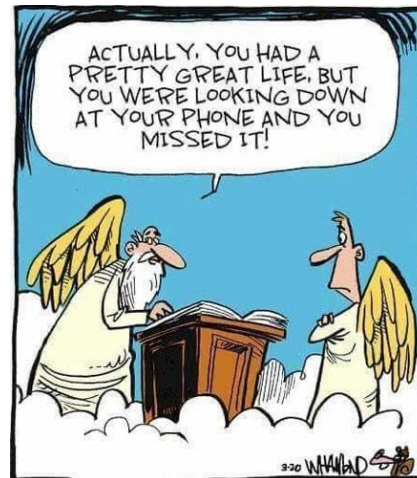
