September Yard of the Month

As the original owners of 2317 Bobwhite Lane, Scott and Zoe Midler have seen a few iterations of their landscaping. The current layout is anchored by 2 (soon to be 3!) flowering pear trees framed by carpet roses with accents of Mountains of White, Shasta Daisies, Peonies, Panchita Manzanita, Dianthus, Seafoam Artemisia, and ornamental grasses all nestled in among large grey boulders and river rock borders. In front of the large home office windows is a rounded Dwarf Colorado Spruce with a small parcel of African Daisies at its base. However, the "star of the show" is the attention-getting Limelight Hydrangea Tree directly in front of the porch. Scott and Zoe also love spending time in the arboreal oasis of their backyard. Two very mature Blaze Maples and a Pagoda Dogwood combine to create a sun-dappled canopy of leaves that provides natural shade over their back-porch pergola. A sandstone paved path winds through a garden filled with a variety of shade loving plants. In the fall, when the leaves change, they are treated to a kaleidoscope of colors. And 40+ bags of leaves!
