Patriot Day

Patriot Day is observed every year on September 11th to commemorate the lives of those who died in the 2001 terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center in New York City and the Pentagon in Virginia, and those who perished when the hijacked United Airlines Flight 93 crashed in Pennsylvania.

Flying a flag at half-staff or half-mast is a sign of grief and mourning. It is flown following the death of certain government officials, in times of national distress, on various holidays, and at any other time it is instructed by the president or government. Due to the significance of Patriot's Day, it is a day in which the flag gets flown at half-mast.

Many events to honor those who tragically lost their loss. Whether it be a parade, a flag ceremony, or simply remembering 9/11. I personally will be participating in the 911 Tower Challenge, which is a way to honor those who lost their lives on 9/11/2001, and in honor of our first responders and military who protect us from foreign and domestic threats. Compliance Matters Arizona!

Is your Unit in compliance with the IRS? Did you file the 990? Which Form applies to my Unit? These are valid questions and you need to know. IRS Form 990N (epost card) may be used when a Unit has gross receipts of \$50,000 or less. IRS Form 990 is required when gross receipts are greater than \$50,000. The due date to file is the 15th day of the 5th month after the closed or the Unit's tax year. Example – Your fiscal year ends June 30, then you are required to file by November 15. Do you need help with this?

Compliance with the State of Arizona requires filing at the Arizona Corporation Commission. As a non-profit you must submit your Annual report. Simply e-file at ACC.gov, create a password and click on the File Annual Report. Then click each button until your report is accepted.

These two simple steps will greatly help you to make sure that you are in compliance and do not jeopardize your non-profit status. For further information, please make sure that you attend Fall Conference next month. Do you have questions? Please feel free to contact this Committee?

Greetings Members,

Did you vote in the Primary? Did you get others to get out and vote? Great! With that being said, I will quickly go over the results from the Primary. I will start with the candidates for the Governor of Arizona. Current Secretary of State Katie Hobbs won the nomination for the Democrat party by 72.3%. Kari Lake won the nomination for the Republican party by a much narrower margin of 48%, to Karrin Taylor Robson's 43.2%. For the U.S. Senate, current Senator Mark Kelly ran unopposed in the Primary and he will be running against Republican Blake Masters. Adrian Fontes won the nomination for the Democratic party for Secretary of State and will be running against Republican Blake Masters. Adrian Fontes won the nomination for the Democratic party for Secretary of State and will be running against Republican Abraham "Abe" Hamadeh. For the U.S. House District 1, Jevin Hodge (D) and Incumbent David Schweikert (R). District 2 Eli Crane (R) and Incumbent Tom O'Halleran (D). District 3, Jeff Zink (R) and Incumbent Ruben Gallego (D). Dist. 4 is Kelly Cooper (R) and Incumbent Greg Stanton (D). Dist. 5 is Javier Ramos (D) and Incumbent (R) Andy Biggs. In Dist. 6 (R) Juan Ciscomani and (D) Kirsten Engel. Dist. 7 Incumbent Raul Grijalva (D) and Luis Pozzolo (R). Debbie Lesko (R) is running unopposed in Dist. 8, and Incumbent Paul Gosar (R) won Dist. 9. As of August 10th, President Biden signed the PACT Act, which will deliver critical health care and other benefits for veterans. The PACT Act was named in honor of Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson, a decorated combat medic who died from a rare form of lung cancer. The PACT Act will provide high-quality health screenings and services related to potential toxic exposures, codifies VA's new process for evaluating and determining presumption of exposure and service connection for various chronic conditions, the legislation removes the need for certain veterans and their survivors to prove service connection if they are diagnosed with one of 23 specific conditions. The PACT Act also requires the VA to conduct new studies of veterans who served in Southwest Asia during the Gulf War and analyses of post-9/11 veterans' health trends. The bill also delivers critical resources to the VA to ensure it can deliver timely access to services and benefits for all eligible veterans. In short, this is historic legislation for our veterans and legislation that was on the top of the list for the American Legion.

In conclusion, I would like to thank Madame President Barbara White, 1st Vice President Rose Ficklin, 2nd Vice President Stacey Mayberry and Mission Training Chairman Karen Smith for giving me the opportunity to attend several past mission training sessions as a Trainee to help me in one day becoming an instructor. I continue to learn more and more every time I attend a session. I encourage anyone that has not attended a mission training to please do so.

All Units should have their Poppy Chairman selected by now. Please be sure your chairman receive a copy of my bulletin each month.

<u>URGENT !!</u> The deadline to order your poppies for 2022-23 is Sept 30, 2022. Your Unit must order at least 100 poppies to be eligible for awards. The order form must be with your order. The form copy was in last months packet on the back of the 1st page. If you have misplaced it, you can get it from Dept. website, aladeptaz.org, first page, just scroll down a bit to the link.

If you plan to set up in front a business for poppy distribution Veterans Day, or any day, you'll need permission, some areas may need a permit. Many businesses need time to pass your request to their main office or headquarters and receive a response back. This takes time. Plan ahead as time passes faster than we anticipate. Many park festivals/ craft shows etc. also have deadlines to sign up for space.

Have you selected your Miss Poppy yet? Please do so if possible, children love to participate. Children feel important when they assist you and it's important for them to learn why we do what we do. They'll have fun being involved with distributions, promotions, riding in parades etc. Speaking of parades, to participate in a Veterans Day parade usually has a deadline also. You can have Miss Poppy wither you have an active Jr. Unit or not. If your Unit wants to include other girls they can be princesses or whatever works for your Unit. The main thing is to involve them, create memories for them with you, teach them, and to have fun supporting our veterans.

How can the money be spent?? Please refer to the Poppy Program Guide as there is far more information than I have room for here. There is specific guidelines that must be followed. Please note: in several places it specifically states-- it is for <u>medical and financial need</u>. You can find the Program Guide on the National Website. Go on the Dept. website, to programs, click top item of Veterans and Military Programs. Below that is Poppy Program. At the end of the paragraph in blue is the link for National Poppy Program. You need to Log In for Member Resources. You will find a download for the guide so you can easily refer to it when needed.

Please keep in mind: Poppy assistance is for Veterans and active duty military. Every Legion member of your Post is a Veteran. Please ensure your Post officers/members understand that if a member is in need they may qualify for an assist through this program. With inflation soaring, please be aware to take care of your own in addition to the outside community. For a member to ask for help can be difficult. Be sure you keep any information of a help request as confidential as possible so as not to embarrass any Legion Family member.

Each State Home is an ALA program by itself. You can make donations to the individual State Home of your choice, Phoenix, Tucson, Yuma or Flagstaff. Or you can donate to the President's Special Project and you can specify which State Home on your Special Project donation. Are you confused yet? With donations to PSP, Madam President hopes to purchase high dollar items much like we did with the Visually Impaired Veterans Special Project where we purchased the tandem bicycle for over \$3000. We also may be able to purchase the typical items such as snacks and gift cards. You are encouraged to continue to support the individual programs at your local State Homes. See the bulletins from those chairmen. Additionally we hope to make an extra impact with this Special Project. Madam President and I are working with Veterans Services to get more information about the needs of the two new homes.

All the State Homes are seeking qualified personnel. This is a big issue impacting the care of the residents, limiting the number of veterans that can be served.

There are two awards your Unit can earn for your work with PSP, the Ginger Cox PSP Award for Unit membership of 200 or less, and the Cathy Jarvis PSP award for Units 201 and over. Both of these awards require a narrative. Please take the time to document your hard work! If you have an event to support PSP, please let me know. These houses can be decorated uniquely and are to be filled with cash for PSP.

This month I want to share with you some of a report I was given on the Agent Orange Awareness Event hosted by Cat Ludwick. August was Agent Orange Awareness Month.

The main event was held at post 58 in Fountain Hills, there were over 200 attendees, we honored a dozen Veterans during the pinning and Welcome Home Ceremony, four widows were recognized and nearly a dozen family members who have lost their Veteran to Agent Orange. The American Legion family were all well represented by members at every level including the Legion Department Commander Mike Simon and Auxiliary President Barbara White. The Purple Heart Association D12 Representative also attended.

As part of the ceremony, we read the names of 64 Veterans who have not only lost their lives to Agent Orange but have been honored in Washington DC. These Veterans names, faces and biographies are on display on the Virtual Wall at the Smithsonian Institute year-round. The ceremony was concluded with the playing of TAPS.

After the event concluded, there was a Memorial ride from Fountain Hills to the Gilbert Water Tower. Both the fountain and the water tower were lit up in Orange. There were over two dozen people holding flags and reading names of the fallen as candles were lit in their memory. Nearly 40 were present. All monies raised went to Veterans Affinity, a Veterans organization that focuses on our older /elderly Veterans and ensuring they have the resources they need to live out their lives as best as possible and for those who are terminally ill or in hospice, they ensure our Veterans die with dignity and do not die alone. What a wonderful event! Thank you to all you came, gave and participated.

Please continue to share your events with me so I can share them with all of you. Keep up the important work you are all doing!

VA&R REPORT TUCSON VA MEDICAL CENTER 7-31-22

All events are suspended until further notice. There is communication that some volunteer activities will be restarting. No specifics as of this date. Thank you volunteers for your help!

Second booster shots (fourth shot) are also now available for those over 50.

Southwest Blind Rehabilitation Center is now open and is resuming outings. Visitation at SAVAHCS is still limited. Monetary donations are being accepted at this time.

There is a new program to assist Veterans patients with food insecurities. A separate food pantry is filling this need. Thank you to Unit 132 for their generous donation to this program.

The grand total of monetary donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2022 to July 31, 2022 is \$400.00.

The grand total of material and activity donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2022 to July 31, 2022 is \$2,106.99. Thank you Unit 39, Unit 66, Unit 109, Unit 131 and Unit 132 for your generous donations to support our programs.

Four registered hospital volunteers donated time which was credited to the American Legion Auxiliary. The grand total of registered volunteer hours May 1, 2022 to July 31, 2022 is 277.5. S AVAHCS is in the process of bringing back volunteers. Volunteers will be phased in as needed and the process will be closely monitored by the Director. Volunteers will be contacted by the Voluntary Service office as their services are needed.

This chairman has volunteered 39.5 hours and logged 420 miles this year in service to the Tucson VA Medical Center as of June 30, 2022. This chairman has now logged over 4,000 hours in service to SAVAHCS. This chairman was re-elected to be the Chairman of the Executive Committee of the VAVS Executive Committee at the meeting on October 12, 2021. This chairman has been elected to fill a three year term on the VAVS Executive Committee. This chairman has attended every Executive Committee meeting and every VAVS meeting this year. This chairman worked with all Units to provide beverages and snacks for staff, patients and volunteers who were manning the COVID-19 vaccination sites. This chairman is working with the Homeless Program to ensure that our Homeless Veterans and those in Transitional Housing have the food and beverages that they need during this time of enormous stress on all community resources. This chairman is working with the Recreation departments to purchase needed supplies for the National Veterans Creative Arts Program and other recreational activities. National Veterans Creative Arts Festival is tentatively planned for September 14 & 15, 2022. Annual Joint Review was completed November 16, 2021.
