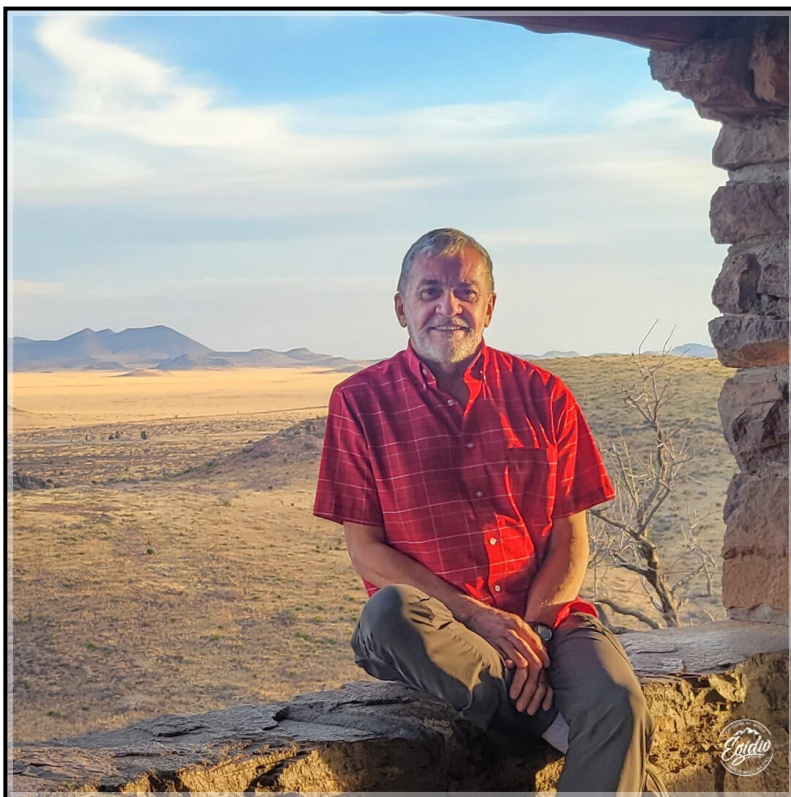

Assignment Topics for 2025 - 2026

January 2025

Evaluation and review

Doors and Windows - An image where the primary subject is a door(s) and/or window(s) of a building or structure. Composition is the key. Any process. Color or monochrome.

March 2025

Tryptic - **Tryptic**. A group of three images side by side in one frame that tells a story or sequence. Color.

May 2025

Motion - the passage of time. Long or short. Color or monochrome.

July 2025

Unusual Vantage Point - An unusual perspective of your subject. Monochrome.

September 2025

Significant Detail - An in-focus image that reveals not just detail, but significant detail within the whole. Color.

November 2025

Insect in Flight - Simply that. Color.

January 2026

An Iconic Austin Mural - Must include the architecture that supports the painting. Color.

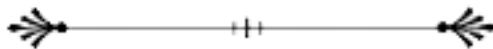
Meeting Minutes for April 3, 2025

The meeting began with Brian Loflin providing an in-depth program on *Understanding Color*. He discussed multiple aspects of color from a photographic standpoint, as differentiated from an artist's perspective. Brian suggested that we set our cameras to use Adobe RGB color to take advantage of the broader spectrum available versus Standard RGB, and he provided detailed information on steps we can take to make sure the colors in our photographs are properly displayed. He showed us how colors are defined in the color wheel by number values, and discussed hue, saturation, and brightness among many other useful facts. He also provided information on tools and processes we can use in achieving proper color balance.

Our next meeting is May 1st and is a photo evaluation and review meeting. The assignment topic is "Motion", and photos can also be submitted in the general category. Fred Peebles will be working on the evaluation and information will be coming on how to get the photos to him.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:20 pm.
