"Truth"

We don't always like to hear the truth, especially about ourselves. We don't even like to tell others the truth, even when it would help them, because we don't want to hurt anyone and we sure don't want anyone getting mad at us.

Remember the evil queen in Snow White? She asked her magic mirror, "Magic mirror, on the wall, who's the fairest of them all?" The mirror continually told her she was, until her step-daughter, Snow White, came of age. Then the magic mirror had to tell the truth about Snow White to the Evil Queen, "Famed is thy beauty, Majesty. But hold, a lovely maid I see. Rags cannot hide her gentle grace. 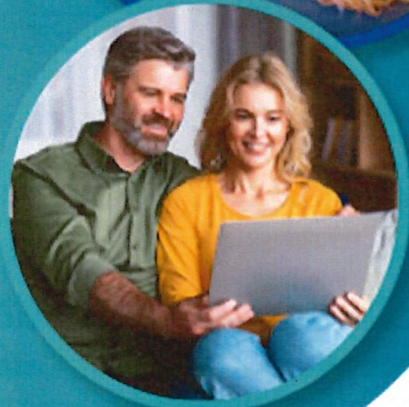
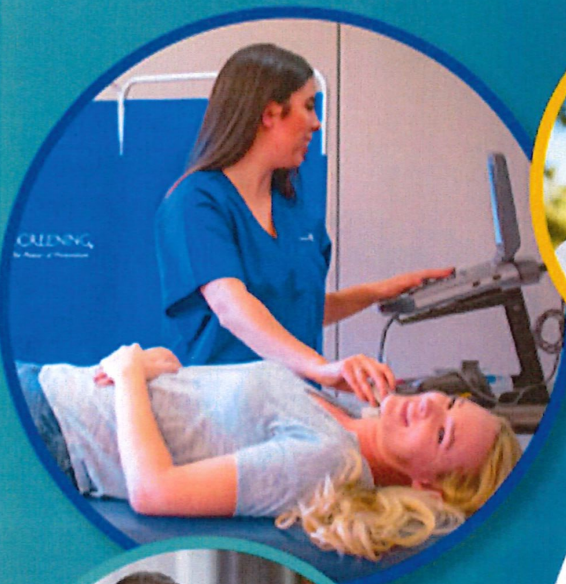
