PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

I must admit that the season of Advent is probably my favorite season of the church year. Why you ask? Because it leads me to anticipate the coming of our Lord in the flesh, born of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, in the City of David, for me and for all of us. How cool is that? The thought that the God who spoke all things into existence loved me so much that He'd put on human flesh to come and to live among us. Then, as if that alone wasn't enough, He came and took all our sins (and they are many) upon Himself and carried them to the cross. There on the cross, our Lord, God incarnate, both 100 percent man and 100 percent God, died, His blood covering the sins of the entire world. And because He died in my place, my sins are forgiven and I am now His precious child washed in the waters of Holy Baptism.



Understanding the fact that we are sinners in need of a loving and gracious Savior puts Advent and Christmas into perspective. Its more than chestnuts roasting on open fires, black Friday, Christmas trees and pretty lights. It's not just about the eggnog and Lifetime movies. Advent is about repentance of our sins and anticipating the coming of the One long promised who burst open the heavens with songs of the angels on that first Christmas morning.

And what about Santa Claus, gifts, and carols? Those are wonderful things to celebrate as well because we know that as Christians our faith does not depend on some jolly elf in a red suit. Rather our faith is found in Jesus who was born for us whose good and gracious gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation, far surpass any that St. Nicholas could ever bring down our chimneys. That is indeed a carol worth singing.

I say all of that to you to say simply this: our Advent theme this year is "Behold the Child." Behold the babe born in Bethlehem, long promised, who came to die for you. Behold the son of Mary who angels, shepherds, and wise men came to worship. Behold the promise of the child, born in the City of David, the Savior, who is Christ the Lord. Behold Jesus, God in the flesh, whose cries from the manger became cries from the cross for you. Behold the child, sinless and perfect, who took upon Himself the sins of the whole world, so that we could be made perfect through the very blood that was poured out for us on the cross. And behold the baby, whose hand once gripped the fingers of his mother and father, stretched out and pierced for you. Behold the child, Christ the Lord.


From the President's Pen



"Behold the Child"




