Pastor's Corner

Happy Groundhog's Day ... Happy Valentines Day ... Happy President's Day. Okay, I got the formalities out of the way. Now, I want to do something a little different than my norm for my pastor salutation. **February 5th** is a special day for me, and particularly special this year. Feb. 5th is my wife Wiebke's birthday. (Fun fact: I've always been able to remember it with the help of a mnemonic device – "Just remember Christmas day Brian – 2/5"). This year is a milestone year – a special birthday (Christmas day x 2). I'm not sure how she'll feel about this little aside ("Surprise"), but I wanted to express how much she means to me as a wife, partner, ally, and friend without peer. Solomon may have said it best (Proverbs 31:10ff.):

A wife of noble character who can find? She is worth far more than rubies. (*Far more*)

¹¹ Her husband has full confidence in her and lacks nothing of value. (*Very true*)

¹² She brings him good, not harm, all the days of her life. (*That is also true*)

¹³ She selects wool and flax and works with eager hands (*Ya'll have probably seen her crochet like a BOSS*) ... ¹⁵ She gets up while it is still night; she provides food for her family (*including the hungry "alarm-clock" cats*)

¹⁶ She considers a field and buys it (*she's an amazing financial steward and helps others to be the same through the knowledge she has gained, biblically and by experience*)

¹⁷ She sets about her work vigorously (*Wiebke is a diligent worker for both her company and through her various ministries with our church teams*) ...

¹⁹ In her hand she holds the distaff and grasps the spindle with her fingers (*well, crochet hook, but close enough – the point is she shares the product of her creativity with others*).

²⁰ She opens her arms to the poor, and extends her hands to the needy. (*She gets this from her mom – she wouldn't want me to list the beneficiaries because she'd quote the Lord to me: "Don't let your left hand know what your right hand is doing" – i.e., don't blow a trumpet for others to hear.*)

²¹ When it snows, she has no fear for her household (*she's a German ... from northern Ohio, people. She's used to Lake effect snow; she doesn't bat an eye to our snow!*)

²² She makes coverings for her bed; she is clothed in **purple** (*her favorite color, no lie*).

²³ Her husband is respected at the city gate, where he takes his seat among the elders of the land (*how bout that - our Session is literally made up of "presbyters" = elders*) ...

²⁵ She is clothed with strength and dignity (*yep*); she can laugh at the days to come.

²⁶ She speaks with wisdom (*her spiritual gift is discernment*) ... and faithful instruction is on her tongue. (*Ask her friends – they'll say Wiebke tells them what they need to hear, not what they 'want' to hear, so they can make wise decisions*)

²⁷ She watches over the affairs of her household (*she's the "FPU nerd" who always has the expertly prepared and detailed budget spreadsheet, her calendars are run like a tight ship, and, I'm just gonna admit it, she's more "handy" than me with almost every power tool.*)

²⁸ Her children arise and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her (*I don't do it enough!*) [Okay, Wiebke, here comes the chief point, the "main thing" ...]

²⁹ "Many women do noble things, but you surpass them all. ³⁰ Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a

woman who fears the LORD is to be praised.”³¹ Honor her for all that her hands have done, and let her works bring her praise at the city gate.

So, Wiebke, since *God’s Word* says such a woman should be praised *publicly* (= “at the city gate”), allow me just these few lines to do so. You’ve said you don’t like chocolates & flowers (and you *especially* don’t want them on Valentines Day). This is the alternative ... I’m incredibly blessed. I love you, and all the more for how you love the Lord.

And *everyone else?* ... If you want to know “what to get” Wiebke for her birthday, I know just the thing – a birthday card (*with a note inside to forgive me for this gushy stuff I’ve shared*).

Look for the women of noble character all around you, and give them a little praise – we all need an accolade once in a while ... but always framed within the mind of Christ – to God alone be the glory! *Sola Dei Gloria*

A Devotional for You Read 1 Timothy 6:6-19

I’ll let you in on a secret. I cherished Paul’s letters to Timothy in my first years as a pastor. When I was fully credentialed at 25, to some I still looked like I just graduated high school. Timothy was *young* and faced the challenges of serving a congregation that looked down on him for his youth. But Paul encourages us (*regardless of our age*) to be good stewards of the *gifts* we have with the *people* he’s placed us with. He concludes his first letter to the ‘young elder’ with a powerful lesson about contentment & Kingdom values.

“What’s in it for me?” – whether we admit it or not, this is a question at the root of much of what we do. The bigger the payback, the more time, energy, or money we’re likely to invest in a pursuit. But that’s worldly stewardship, not spiritual stewardship. That’s not living by grace. Living by God’s grace asks the question, “Since I’ve received freely from God, what’s ‘in it’ for *them*?” Some of us joined the church we attend based on what it could give us: people our age, good programs, activities for children, etc. I’m not naïve; I know this is usually the criteria often used, but I also know God often works through our intentions, to lead us to something better.

In v. 10 we have one of the most misquoted verses in the Bible – you’ve almost certainly heard “money is the root of all evil” ... it’s amazing how just a couple simple words completely change the meaning – it literally says: “the *love* of money is the root of all *kinds* of evil.” Jesus talked about the perils of “serving mammon.” The idea is that the more we focus on material wealth and provision, inevitably, the *poorer* our spiritual stewardship will be. I read a quote this week: “Some people are so poor all they have is money.” Paul is adamantly warning the church (including us) not to allow greed or selfishness to distract us from the things that are really worth going after (verse 11): *righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, and gentleness*. These are the things that belong to the

“other Master” – the one opposite of Mammon. You know his name. “Though he was in the form of God, he did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but humbled himself, taking the form of a servant” (Phil. 2) ... and “though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich.” (2 Cor. 8:9).

Steward these greater things (v. 11) in your life; ask God to build them in you more and more. For example, is God allowing you to go through hard times? That may be a great time to learn endurance; *don't quit*. Endurance is learned by persevering, not by avoiding hardship, or bowing out saying, “This isn't worth the trouble.” And *love*? God may have linked you with someone who is hard to love because that way we learn to *really* love (Christlike love) – they might even need love the most; but you become better at love not with the “easy people” but with the “EGR's” as I call them (*Extra Grace Required*).

Pursuing the best riches takes effort. Choose well which kind you will pursue, because they lead in very different directions. Paul gives us the same “investment” advice he gave Timothy. The Christian life is not for the fainthearted. There will be a lot of resistance out there. We need to be prepared to stand against any force that tries to dissuade us from following Christ. “Fight the good fight of the faith” and take hold of the life to which you were called.

New Door Installation

After numerous delays, freezing weather and scheduling issues, the Upkeep Committee is happy to report that the new Faith Hall front doors have been replaced. Please stop over and take a look at them.

While it may seem unusual to get excited about something as mundane as a door, these doors are rather unique. The glass doors are storefront style. They have a wide frame that is attractive to the eye and even enhances the overall look of the front of the building. The door system is one large oversized door with a stationary door panel taking up the rest of the adjacent space. This allows for easier movement for wheel chair and walker access. If needed the stationary panel can be unlatched to accommodate the moving in and out of even larger oversized items.

We are happy with the doors because the old door's closing mechanism was frequently breaking down and had reached the point that a make shift repair was no longer satisfactory.

We wish to thank Bellone Glass of Arnold for their work on this project. They were a pleasure to work with and their professionalism met all our expectations.

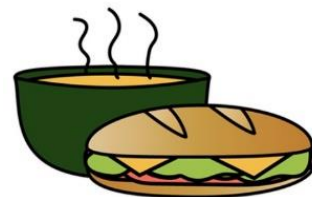
The metal backdoors of Faith Hall have been built and are in the hands of the contractor. This is a different contractor from the glass front doors. He has put a hold on the installation until the weather improves.

Please take a good look at Faith Hall, over the last couple of years we have made needed improvements in numerous areas. The lighting system has been totally replaced, this includes the kitchen, with more efficient LED lights. The tile floor has been replaced with a more attractive and durable epoxy floor. A wide screen television has been added to enhance our technical capabilities. Ten lighter weight tables have been added to our inventory. This allows us more flexibility and ease of handling for our events. The interior walls were recently painted and new curtains and blinds were installed. Both restrooms were painted and new towel and soap dispensers were put in place. And lastly, both doors will soon have been replaced improving the building look and security.

We wish to thank you, the congregation, for your help and support on all of these projects.

Burrell wrestlers defeat Highlands to earn 22nd straight section title**

Jacob Taylor's attitude before his 189-pound match Wednesday night highlighted what has allowed the Burrell wrestling program to maintain its section dominance over the past 25 years.

The sophomore was making his first start in a dual against Highlands that would determine the Section 9-2A title.

But Taylor already had laid the foundation to be ready for such a match.

"We stay physical in our room," Taylor said. "It's about the work. Give your practice partners a good look, they'll give you a good look. Keep everybody in shape and everybody in line."

Taylor, who went 2-2 at the Westmoreland County championships in his only other varsity action of the season, won by tech fall as the Buccaneers beat Highlands, 48-21, to earn their 22nd straight section title.

Burrell (10-1, 4-0) last missed out on winning the section when Mt. Pleasant finished first in 2003.

"It's what we do," Buccaneers coach Steve Ansani said. "We wanted to keep steamrolling through teams. You don't want to give up what Burrell has done for the last 22 years."

The match was initially supposed to be at Highlands but was moved to Burrell because of school closures at Highlands.

Taylor set the pace by scoring a first-round takedown and followed up with nearfall points. He built a 7-0 lead after the first period and finished the tech fall with a late takedown.

"It's definitely a lot of pressure," Taylor said. "My first varsity match. I've wrestled a bunch of JV time. I haven't wrestled a lot of good opponents. That was a tough, strong, physical opponent."

Ansani said he was happy with how Taylor wrestled. Burrell wanted to get him some work ahead of a tournament this weekend.

"He cut down from 215 to 189, and I wanted to give him a shot and see what he could do to get ready for Bedford," Ansani said.
