Sunday ♦ Travel Day

After an early morning departure, we'll travel to Portland, Maine where we will stay overnight.

Monday ♦ St. John, NB

This afternoon we'll meet our local guide at Reversing Falls in Saint John, New Brunswick. When the waters of the Bay of Fundy and the St. John River collide, the flow of the river is reversed, causing rapids and whirlpools to form. Dinner will be at a restaurant overlooking the Falls with access to the Skywalk. (B, D)

Tuesday ♦ Charlottetown, PE

Today we'll drive through Fundy National Park to Hopewell Rocks, site of the highest tides in the world. Here giant flowerpots have been carved from the cliffs by the force of the mighty Fundy tides. If the tide is low, we may be able to walk on the ocean floor. Later, we'll cross Confederation Bridge to Prince Edward Island and enjoy a traditional lobster dinner, tasty chowder or soup, locally cultivated mussels, salad, homemade rolls, and a dazzling array of scrumptious sweets! An alternative to lobster will be available. Our overnight accommodations will be here on the island. (B, D)

Wednesday ♦ Baddeck, NS

We'll depart this morning to visit Green Gables, famous worldwide as the setting in Lucy Maud Montgomery's fictional work, *Anne of Green Gables*. We'll travel through Prince Edward Island National Park, known for its red sandstone cliffs, fine white sandy beaches, dunes and lush green fields. At Wood Island, we'll board a ferry for a 75-minute crossing of the Northumberland Strait to Nova Scotia, then across the Canso Causeway to Cape Breton, the Scotland of North America. Baddeck is where we will spend the next two nights. (B, D)

Thursday ♦ Local Touring/Cabot Trail, NS

Today discover why Conde Nast rated Cape Breton one of the top ten islands in the world as we travel the Cabot Trail. The road winds around the rocky splendour of Cape Breton's northern shore, ascending to the incredible plateaus of Cape Breton Highlands National Park, where the mountains meet the sea! Overlooks offer unforgettable vistas of Cape Breton's rugged coastline. We will stop in Cheticamp, on the shores of the Gulf of St. Lawrence, famous for its "hooked" crafts and Acadian culture and enjoy a picnic lunch in the Park. Later, we'll enjoy a whale watch boat tour while en route around the trail.

Friday ♦ Halifax, NS

After breakfast at the hotel, we will visit the Alexander Graham Bell Museum and then travel to Halifax. This afternoon we'll take a tour of this historic port city, the capital of Nova Scotia. Hear stories of Halifax during the war years, including the Halifax Explosion and the city's role in the recovery operations after the Titanic disaster. See the universities, downtown area and make a picture stop at the Halifax Citadel National Historic Site, situated high on a hill overlooking the downtown. Stroll through the Public Gardens, a fine example of a formal Victorian public garden. Once we arrive at our Halifax accommodations, dinner and the evening are on our own with suggestions from our local guide. (B)



Saturday ♦ Halifax to St. John

We set off early this morning for the quaint fishing village of Peggy's Cove where we will eat breakfast. Here a graceful lighthouse sits on top of the smooth wave-worn granite of the coast. The tiny harbor below the lighthouse is a masterpiece of seasoned fish sheds and colorful fishing boats, making it one of the most photographed places in Canada. Later we'll travel across the province to the scenic Annapolis Valley and learn about the expulsion of the Acadians at Grand Pre National Historic Site. In Digby, we'll board the ferry for a 3-hour crossing of the Bay of Fundy to Saint John, NB where we'll spend our final night in Canada. (Today's attractions may vary depending on the sailing time of the Digby Ferry. The 2020 schedule is yet to be determined.) (B, BL)

Sunday ♦ Portland, ME

We will say farewell to our Atlantic Tours tour director after breakfast and begin our journey home with many fond memories of our time in The Maritimes. We'll arrive in Portland for our overnight stay. (B)

Monday ♦ Travel Home

After breakfast at the hotel, we'll depart for home, arriving in South Jersey at approximately 7PM to begin our local drop offs. (B)
