Join Willistown Troop 78 as we head to Jack Frost Ski Resort in the Poconos for a day of skiing on Sunday, January 26. The bus will be leaving the cabin at 6:30 AM sharp to make the drive up the Pennsylvania Turnpike for a day of fun on the slopes. If you haven't been to Jack Frost recently, you're in for a treat! Jack Frost has the best snowmaking capability in the Poconos and has trails for the expert and novice alike. If you've never skied or boarded, Jack Frost has one of the premier instructional programs on the East Coast. And if you're an experienced boarder or skier, you'll love Jack Frost's board park and the challenges of East

Mountain! Check out the trail map, the lodge and a live web cam showing the fabulous conditions at www.jfbb.com.

Families are welcome to join the Scouts, and family members can take advantage of our group rates. While we cannot accommodate families on the bus, you can drive up to Frost on your own, or you can follow the bus. Directions will be available. Driving time is about 1:45 from the Cabin.

Note: All Scouts and family members that ski or board with us on this trip MUST wear helmets – no exceptions! Helmets are available for rental at Jack Frost for an additional charge of \$10 per person.

Our group rates are set out below. Flyers will be available at the first troop meeting after New Year's Day and will also be available at the Father/Son trip. Don't miss out on a great day of skiing and snowboarding with Troop 78!

HEADING TO WALT DISNEY WORLD WITH TROOP 78? Reserve Your Spot for Spring Break 2014 – April 11 - 19

With a five-day Park-Hopper ticket, you can visit any of the four theme parks (Magic Kingdom, Disney's Hollywood Studios, Animal Kingdom, and Epcot), and you can use your pass for up to five visits to DisneyQuest and the water parks (Typhoon Lagoon, Blizzard Beach), or just swim and hang out at the Fort Wilderness campground at any time.

Our Troop Committee has determined eligibility as, those Scouts who -

- are registered and active in the troop (50% minimum participation),
- attended or worked at summer camp at least one week in 2013.
- 3) are *or will be* First Class rank by March 22nd, and
- 4) are responsible enough to visit the theme parks on their own with a small group of other Scouts as determined by their parents and the Scoutmaster.

The total cost including bus transportation, food, camping fees, a five-day Park-Hopper Disney pass, is expected to be **only \$515.00**. Money from your Scout camping account may be used for this trip. A \$200 deposit is due by **January 17th**. Note: Although all meals are provided at the campsite, most Scouts bring \$100 to \$150 spending money for food (lunch in the parks), beverages, souvenirs, etc.

Reserve your spot now by sending your deposit of \$200 per person via check payable to Willistown Troop 78, B.S.A., to Miles Stevens, 1130 Paxson Hollow Rd., Media, PA 19063, or bring it to a troop meeting. You may use your Scout camping account money by calling or e-mailing Mr. Joe Cady at (610) 647-4037, jcady@comcast. net.

Once you reserve a spot you will receive further instructions

regarding departure times, what to pack, spending money, bus preparation etc.

We must have at least 20 Scouts and adults to camp at Disney. If we do not have 16 Scouts, we will have to cancel; so talk it up!

SEA BASE – SUMMER 2015 Signup Meeting January 10

There will be a meeting on January 10 at 6 PM at the cabin (an hour before the troop meeting) to sign up for Sea Base - Summer 2015.

Parents should attend and should be prepared to make a \$100 per person deposit if their Scout (or Scout and Dad) wish to go.

We will be signing up for the Sea Base "Aqua Adventure" program. This is an eight-day open water Scuba diving trip to the Florida Keys that runs either Wednesday - Wednesday or Sunday - Sunday.

At our meeting on January 10 we will decide which weeks of Summer 2015 will work for our group. Parents should bring calendars as well as checkbooks.

At the meeting we also will discuss all of the details of the trip and trip preparation (Scuba certification, etc). Scouts need to be 13 years old AND finished 8th grade OR 14 years old at the time of the trip.

For Scouts (and Dads) the January 10 meeting is the Go/No Go decision point.

2013 POINSETTIA SALE RESULTS

Well, the results are in and you auvs broke the records! Highest sales of any year and most plants sold, ever! This year also had the highest sales per Scout ratio, which indicates that some of you took advantage of making high volume sales to corporate and organization customers. For the first time ever the troop sold over a thousand plants (1044), so many in fact our grower had to schedule an extra delivery day. Great job everyone and a special thank you to all of the parents who helped their sons transport and deliver poinsettias to their customers!

Now for the Salesmen of the Year Awards: First we should mention that four of you sold over \$1,000 each. Eight Scouts sold more than 35 plants and more than half the Scouts selling poinsettias this year sold more than 20 plants each. Great job, gentlemen, you all worked very hard to do your best. Here are the results of the top 5 salesmen: Coming in 5th place with 53 plants sold was Nathan Motel. In fourth place with 66 plants sold was Harry Tredinnick. In third place with 75 plants sold and \$1,090 in sales was Andrew Brown. second place, with 86 plants sold and \$1,200 in sales was Ethan Bilson and in first place with 113 plants sold for a whopping \$1,250 in sales was (drum roll, please) Michael Orlow.

New for this year is the award for top-selling patrol. The prize for top-selling patrol is the "Head of the Line Pass" which grants the entire patrol the privilege to be at the front of the line for all meals and events at this year's Winter Camp. That prize goes to the Flying Eagle Patrol. Congratulations, gentlemen!

MICHAEL BENNETT AWARDED NESA ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP

The National Eagle Scout (NESA) Association recently announced its 2013 scholarship recipients. Troop 78 alumnus and Eagle Scout Michael Bennett was the recipient of a NESA Academic Scholarship. Michael attends Lafayette College and is pursuing a dual major in civil engineering and history. He was one of only 218 winners selected from a highly competitive pool of over 5,000 applicants.

According to the NESA website, NESA scholarship applicants must be Eagle Scouts who are members of NESA and who are graduating high school and entering college in the year for which they apply for a scholarship. Scholarships awarded only to those who graduate from high school in the calendar year in which their scholarship is presented. And whose Eagle Scout board of review

occurs in the same year as their year of high school graduation. Those Scouts can apply for a NESA scholarship in that calendar year.
