Legislative

April 2021

Greetings,

I hope this finds all of you in good health and spirits. As of the writing of this bulletin, Governor Doug Ducey is starting to lift restrictions, including seating capacity. This includes the mandatory opening of schools by March 15th. Many are still wearing masks and socially distancing. Others are getting vaccinated.

President Biden and Congress passed another COVID Relief Stimulus bill.

As many of you know the Governor and President, are still giving daily briefings on the COVID-19 pandemic. The Governor has started to allow some elective surgeries. There are two vaccines approved by the FDA, by Pfizer and Moderna. Johnson and Johnson are also jumping aboard and working on getting a one dose vaccine approved by the FDA, as opposed to the two dose ones available now.

Protests and demonstrations in Washington DC as well as State Capitols including ours have died down somewhat, but strict security restrictions are still in place due to threats on elected officials and COVID restrictions. The fence surrounding the U.S. Capitol is now a permanent fixture. Our State Capitol will also soon have a permanent non scaleable fence surrounding the Executive Tower, House, Senate and Museum. The State Legislature is currently working on passing bills from last session.

IMPORTANT – YOUR YEAR END REPORTS ARE DUE TO ME BY MAY 1ST!!!! I only received two Mid-Year Reports in December. It is vital to our organization that these reports are done. It is important that these Legislative reports are done on a Unit level, so that the Department Chairmen have something to give to National to take to Congress. Please send your reports in by May 1st, 2021, even if you were unable to do anything. Thank You.

In closing, please stay healthy and positive. Remember, we are all in this together. Please remember, to be kind and patient with one another. 

So far, we've learned about Commitment, Consistency, Creativity and Communication. This month, let's look at:

Credibility: The quality of being trusted and believed in.

<u>trustworthiness</u> · <u>reliability</u> · <u>dependability</u> · <u>integrity</u> · <u>character</u> · <u>reputation</u> ·

This might seem incredibly obvious—and yet it is not always easy to achieve. In an organization that is comprised of volunteers, commitments are sometimes not taken seriously and life "priorities' can take last minute precedence. If your Unit does not show up for a meeting or a table is left empty at a benefit, you are risking your reputation as a credible partner. That can be hard for a business, school or an elected official to understand. They begin to wonder why they should support you!

Engaging your community is serious business and should not be taken lightly:

- Don't make a commitment if you aren't positive your unit can deliver
- Make sure volunteers understand what is expected of them—and when.
- Commit less than you think you can manage—having more people show up, raising more money, having a better float for the parade are pleasant surprises!
- Be on time!
- Dress better than you think is required.
- Follow-up on outstanding questions or issues. No one expects you to have all the answers on hand, but they do expect you to get them.

VA&R REPORT TUCSON VA MEDICAL CENTER 2-28-21

All events are suspended until further notice. Thank you volunteers for your help!

Moderna vaccine has arrived and all staff who desired vaccination have been vaccinated. All at risk Veterans and those 75+ and 65+ have been offered the two dose vaccine. Currently working on Veterans 55+. Current numbers are encouraging according to Director.

Southwest Bind Rehabilitation Center is now closed until COVID-19 numbers improve. There is NO visitation at SAVAHCS. Monetary donations are being accepted at this time. American Legion Auxiliary Gift Shop will have to be done differently this year. The hospital is asking for lists from nursing staff of items needed by Veteran patients. They have requested that all service organizations work together to fill these needs with no duplication. American Legion Auxiliary Christmas Gift Shop donated \$4,000.00 worth of gift cards in support this effort. February was National Salute to Veterans during the week of Valentines Day. Gift bags and items were donated by Service Organizations and community groups. Unit 132 donated coffee pods and snacks for the Infusion Suite. There is a new program in start-up process to assist Veterans patients with food insecurities. Once implemented, a separate food pantry will fill this need.

The grand total of monetary donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2020 to February 28, 2021 is \$800.

The grand total of material and activity donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for February 1, 2020 to February 28, 2021 is \$39,950.29. This amount includes the Christmas Gift Shop donation for 2019. Thank you Unit 7, Unit 24, Unit 66, Unit 68, Unit 131 and Unit 132 for your generous donations to support our programs.

Four registered hospital volunteers donated time which was credited to the American Legion Auxiliary. The grand total of registered volunteer hours May 1, 2020 to February 28, 2021 is 658. **S AVAHCS is in the process of bringing back volunteers.** Volunteers will be phased in as needed and the process will be closely monitored by the Director. Volunteers will be contacted by the Voluntary Service office as their services are needed. One more Auxiliary volunteer has been called back. This effort is currently being reevaluated due to current numbers and availability of vaccine.

This chairman has volunteered 119.5 hours and logged 1,680 miles this year in service to the Tucson VA Medical Center as of February 28, 2021. This chairman has now logged over 4,000 hours in service to SAVAHCS. This chairman was elected to be the Chairman of the Executive Committee of the VAVS Executive Committee at the meeting on October 8, 2020. The audit of the books was completed. This chairman is working with the Homeless Program to ensure that our Homeless Veterans and those in Transitional Housing have the food and beverages that they need during this time of enormous stress on all community resources. This chairman is working with the Recreation departments to purchase needed supplies for the National Veterans Creative Arts Program and other recreational activities. Annual Joint Review was completed November 10, 2020.
