#### IMPORTANT COVID-19 NOTICE

#### CLOSED TO PUBLIC UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE







Dear Ratepayers of B-Say-Tah,

Please be advised that Council of the Resort Village of B-Say-Tah has reduced the base tax and mil rate for the year 2020 ONLY. The **mil rate** has been **set to 1.57** from 3.15. The **base tax** has been **reduced to \$700** from \$800.00.

The Resort Village of B-Say-Tah has reserves that have accumulated over several years and we feel that now is the right time to use our reserve funds to compensate for the reduction in taxes, as a way of helping out the residents as we work through the COVID- 19 pandemic in 2020. The 15% municipal discount will remain the same as years past for the months of August and September.

The major items for 2020, will continue as planned: Mackie Hill area drainage and culverts, completion of the Multi-Use court at the commons & water system, and paying.

We will be applying for funding from the Municipal Economic Enhancement Program that has been recently announced to municipalities from the Provincial Government for 2020. The funding will be put towards enhancing the Village Commons for the enjoyment and use by the ratepayers.

Another positive item is that we secured a three year contract with Valley Lawn Services to continue with village maintenance, lawn care, and waste collection.

Please note, that we have ONLY budgeted for sports days, swimming lessons and fireworks, none of these activities can occur unless the Provincial Government allows this phase to proceed.

## 2020 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Please note that due to the current COVID-19 global pandemic, the date for the **Municipal Election has changed to August 29, 2020** rather than July 25, 2020. There will be an Advanced poll, date to be decided, we will notify you as soon as it is set. **Mark your Calendars for August 29 to cast your vote from 8:00am – 9:00pm**. More information to follow when the call for nominations will be. Election will be held at the Village shop as it was 4 years ago. There will be more information to follow about social distancing requirements and how this will take place during the election. Reminder, you will need your photo ID to vote. More info to follow.

#### YARD DEBRIS AND WASTE COLLECTION

Please see schedule to the left. Debris will be collected every other Monday for June, July, Aug. Every Monday in May & September. Please have it out by **7am sharp** to ensure pick up. If it is missed it will be collected with the waste collection on Tuesdays. Waste Collection is every Tuesday starting at **7am sharp**. Please ensure that your waste is bagged, tied and put in secure sturdy bins with lids that cannot be knocked over easy. No more than 40lbs per bag.

## **NVWMA INC. (LANDFILL)**

Call ahead to the landfill before hauling any demo waste. Limit on asphalt and concrete of 33,000lbs on back axel. Landfill is not accepting cash at the moment please use debit or credit. Social distancing requirements to follow.

#### FIRE CHARGES FOR CALL OUTS

Reminder that things are still quite dry out, use precaution and common sense etc. As per our bylaws for fire call outs the Village will cover the first \$1000.00 of the call out should you require the fire department's assistance. You will be responsible for the remainder of the costs if any. A \$600 minimum fee for fire dept. to attend for first hour plus a \$200 fee per every hour after that. Refer to our bylaws posted on the Village website, keep your insurance company informed.

Please obtain all necessary permits prior to any development/building or demolition within the Village. If you are unsure if you need one, please call or email the office.


