## Rockford Town Regular Council Meeting July 19, 2017 7:00pm

Mayor Carrie Roecks called the meeting to order at 7:00pm with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call took place. Those present were Mayor Carrie Roecks, Councilmembers Clint Stevenson, Micki Harnois, Tim Fricke, William Benson and Brian Laude. Clerk Treasurer Kristy Cochrane and Public Works, Dave Thompson. Several residents were also in attendance.

Mr. Benson made a motion to approve the agenda for July 19<sup>th</sup>, 2017. Ms. Harnois seconded the motion. Motion was carried.

Mr. Benson made a motion to approve the minutes from the June 21<sup>st</sup> Regular council meeting. Mr. Stevenson seconded the motion. Motion was carried. With the one mistake to be fixed on line 18, Mr. Stevenson.

Mrs. Harnois made a motion to approve the minutes from the July 5<sup>th</sup> Regular council meeting. Mr. Benson seconded the motion. Motion was carried.

## **PUBLIC COMMENT**

Ms. Roecks announced that the Moyer residence was on fire and that the fire department was tracking the water usage and reporting it back to Mr. Thompson.

Mr. Benson thanked the Fire Department for all their hard work.

Scott Wilson with Apollo Solutions Group presented the council with the program information and the services that they offer in trying to find ways for the Town to save on energy costs. Council would like more time to discuss details and options.

Mr. Merritt with JUB submitted project updates.

 Mr. Merritt asked council if they wanted the outlets on the new light poles high or low. Mr. Thompson said if they could keep them the same height that they are right now, it would work best. Ms. Roecks signed the First Street lighting project contract. Mr. Merritt said that he hoped that the lighting project would be finished up by fair time.

Mr. Merritt said that the estimate for the stump grinding came in at about \$1400.00 which will be covered by grant money from the First Street Lighting Project.
