"Joshua fought the battle of Jericho, Jericho, Jericho. Joshua fought the battle of Jericho and the walls came tumbling down.

Iused to love this bible school song. If I'm being honest, I have always loved the conquest of the promised land. The Israelite people are wandering, for so long they are a people without a home. They face all manner of trials and struggles in the wilderness and have finally come to, and entered, the land that God promised to their ancestors. Joshua enters to lead the people into the promised land. As a child, I had an image in my mind of this superhero Joshua, this conquering hero, this great man of God. Joshua was the first larger than life character I found in the scriptures. His faithfulness, his military prowess, his leadership, were all qualities I was conditioned to love and respect. I never questioned the glory of Joshua and the Israelites invasion of the land. And maybe it is as glorious and wonderful as it used to be in my mind.

But now, when I see Russian tanks, guns, and military personnel strategically aligning themselves around the borders of Ukraine, and the incursion of the country, I can't help but wonder if my praise of Israel's conquest was misplaced. There is much in the scriptures that when reflected upon with sober adult eyes can be challenging. Israel was an invading army! The story of Noah is a story of genocide of all the people on the planet! David is celebrated, at least in part, because he was a great war lord! There are parts in the scripture we may struggle to accept or understand. These violent passages are on the list. As are stories like Jephthah and his daughter. (look it up) I want you to know it is "OK" to struggle to understand God's involvement and place in some of these stories.

It is not always easy to see, understand, or accept God's role and involvement in the world. Where do we see the hand of God in the mess we see in Ukraine? How do we see God working in the suffering of a child with cancer? How do we reconcile a loving God with the pain of a pandemic or the death of a loved one? It is necessary for Christians to address and wrestle with these questions in our faith walks.

March 2nd is Ash Wednesday which marks the beginning of the Lenten season. Lent is a time of reflection leading to the pain of Good Friday, when Christ died on the cross, to the ultimate joy of Easter morning, with a resurrected Christ. Lent is a time of discipline, as we prepare ourselves to be followers of Jesus. As such I have to think this is a great time for us to explore these challenging questions as we take a critical look at our faith. As we evaluate our own understanding of difficult scripture, perhaps we can apply the lessons of this Lenten season. Perhaps knowing that this Lenten journey concludes in violence, suffering, blood and death; but also in resurrection, hope, and new life, will help us see God's presence and glory not just in the light, but also in the dark. Perhaps struggling with uncomfortable scripture will help us connect with God not just in the celebration of the empty tomb, but also in the conflict of Jesus and the money changers or the betrayal of Judas. Perhaps we will learn, that in all aspects of life, and in all situations of the world, and in all things, good and bad, God is present! God is good! Death is never the final word.

Look for God in the pain and suffering you see in the world. Sometimes that is where we see Christ the clearest!

Join with us as we embark upon a Lenten journey toward the cross. Mark the following dates and times on your calendar, invite friends and family to come with you.


Feb 2nd ASH WEDNESDAY

The Chancel Choir will continue its Wednesday evening rehearsals in the choir room at 7 P.M. through the Easter Season and part of May. We always welcome new faces! All you need is a nice singing voice and the desire to learn while enjoying fun and fellowship through the gift of music that God has blessed us with.
