For a number of years, Ebenezer has provided winter coats for the children of Westmoreland County. This year, thanks to your generosity, we purchased 46 coats to keep kids warm. The coats are distributed to those that need them by Westmoreland County Social Services.

Special thanks to Ralph and Linda Fallin, who purchased the coats and brought them to Worship service in November to be blessed before delivering them to Westmoreland County.

Operation Christmas Child

Ebenezer participated in this year's Operational Christmas Child, a project of Samaritan's Purse, that provides shoeboxes stuffed with goodies, including toys, hygiene products, school supplies and other useful things, to boys and girls in countries around the world. Kim Shortell, who spearheaded our participation this year, reported a total of 30 boxes to be sent. Our Change for Change collection on the third Sunday in November was donated to the project to pay shipping expenses.

Community Supports Food Pantry

The Community Thanksgiving Service, held this year on November 24 at Yeocomico Church in Kinsale, donated the offering collected to the Ebenezer's Food Pantry.

Christmas in Kinsale, an annual event to be held this year on December 7, donates a third of their proceeds to Ebenezer's Food Pantry, as well. Last year, Christmas in Kinsale gave a total of \$3,160 to our Food Pantry.

Ebenezer's Food Pantry, one of six pantries in Westmoreland County, is open on the 3rd Saturday of each month from 9 to 11 am. Our own Scott Flickinger works at the Healthy Harvest Food Bank, which provides the food, and Debbie Messick is the point person for EUMC's Pantry. Volunteers are always needed to help on Food Pantry weekends.

"Suffer the little children to come unto me for of such is the kingdom of heaven."





Consistent with our theme, Dr. Michael Perry, Superintendent of Westmoreland County Public Schools, was invited to be our guest speaker for both nights of **Revival**, Nov 1-2, 2019. Dr. Perry is pastor of Foster Memorial Baptist Church in Rocky Mount, NC. He earned a BS degree in Theology and Teacher Certification from Cairn University in PA and earned his Master's Degree in Elementary Education and his Doctorate in Educational Administration from East Carolina University.

Dr. Perry provided inspirational and thoughtprovoking messages that captivated everyone in attendance both evenings of revival. Dr. Perry reminded us that God's people must do more than simply sit, talk and listen – we must act. Dr. Perry made it clear that we must reach out into our community with passion and commitment if we are going to bring all of our neighbors together to worship Christ.

On the first evening of Revival, beautiful and lively music was provided by K-K King, our Worship Team and the Men's Chorus from Jerusalem Baptist Church. On the second evening, in addition to K-K and our Worship Team, the Youth Choir of Siloam Baptist Church also provided lively, spirit-filled music. At the end of the worship service, Siloam's Youth Choir, our Worship Team and the entire congregation joined together for the closing songs in a genuine display of love and praise.

In another show of love, revival offerings in the amount of \$1,006.00 were donated to the Westmoreland County Public Schools to be used to purchase books for our school children.

Homecoming, on Sunday, Nov 3, began with fellowship and light refreshments and was followed by an enjoyable "**Song Service**" featuring talent from Ebenezer along with guest musician Sharon Mann. Our own Rebecca Rumburg, Ebenezer's pastor since 2014, led our Sunday's Homecoming service. Pastor Rebecca is a graduate of Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, DC, where she received her Master of Divinity degree.

It was wonderful to see the sanctuary filled with neighbors and guests and some of our own that we hadn't seen in a while as well as our "regulars." The Homecoming spirit was palpable!

A Homecoming offering in the amount of \$6,321.00 was collected, with \$3,497.03 designated for our new community playground, currently under construction. Homecoming concluded with a luncheon featuring our traditionally great food and wonderful fellowship.

Thanks to all who were involved in the planning and execution of these soul-stirring events, from the singers and musicians who shared their talents, to everyone who contributed food for the luncheon, to those "behind the scenes" making sure everyone attending felt the love of the Love Movement. And of course, many thanks to Dr. Perry and Pastor Rebecca for the spiritual messages they shared.

The excitement of revival and homecoming continues, and the passion and commitment to move forward with *"The Love Movement"* is evident. On Sunday afternoon, Nov 17, we held the first of what will be a number of gatherings to develop an action plan for our next steps in reaching out into the community. Join the Movement. Ebenezer Playground Construction Underway!

Fun is under construction at Ebenezer! Thanks to the labor of many and the generosity of the entire community, our new children's playground is taking shape. Special thanks to Bruce Beahm, Bill Taylor, Smitty Smith and Kevin Potts for their tenacity in interpreting the instructions. Bruce writes, "We'll get 'er done, but could use some young men to assist." Contact Bruce for the work schedule.

Our playground, which is used by neighborhood children as well as by the young children of our own congregation, now has new swings, slides, and fun stuff to climb on, and special groundcover to prevent injuries from falls (and rough-housing!).



We still have a way to go to finish the construction, and also a way to go to cover the costs. The Church Council approved a budget of \$20,000 for the project, and to date we have raised a little more than two-thirds of that amount, including a donation of over \$3,000 from our Homecoming service.



Robert H. Gawen and Sons, Inc., donated their services for site preparation. Beasley Concrete, Inc., of Callao, contributed concrete and donated the delivery fee.

Contributors include the Jim and Martha Kee estate, the Moose Lodge in Callao, the UMM, the UMW, and the Church Council, as well as the many individuals who have given so generously to make this happen. Thanks to you all!

When the playground construction is complete, we will have a ribbon-cutting ceremony, inviting all the children of the community to come and "test-drive" the new equipment. Watch your church bulletin for more about this celebration.
