

### **August 18 ~ Bill Groneman ~ Writer, Musician, 9/11 First Responder**

Each generation has had at least one incident that they felt changed their lives forever. Eighty years ago, the attack on Pearl Harbor shocked the nation. Almost 60 years ago President Kennedy was assassinated in Dallas. This September it will have been 20 years since the attack on the United States that brought down the Twin Towers in New York City. At our August Summer Luncheon, we will hear a first-hand report from Bill Groneman, a former Captain with FDNY Engine Company 308, who was one of 16,000 members of the department who responded to the fall of the Twin Towers on 9/11. He plans to go back to New York on September 11, 2021, the 20-year anniversary of the disaster that forever changed our way of life. Mr. Groneman has a degree in history and was researching and writing about the Alamo long before he retired from his 29-year career with the Fire Department in New York. Since moving to the home of the Alamo he has continued to write and make many guest appearances to share history he has studied and lived.

**House Report – Susan Gargotta, House Chairman**

We are making substantial progress in securing the Woodward Mansion. The back gate blocking outside access to the upper levels of the stairwell has been secured. Bexar C&R removed the fire escape on the front of the house. That was a two-day job. They are now milling the new spindles to close the opening that was left on the top balcony.

Still needed to be done.

1. Fortifying the ramp to the front porch. The homeless have been storing their belongings and trash under the existing ramp and possibly sleeping there as well.
2. Installing an emergency push bar to the door to the back stairwell. The exit signs are to be removed from the doors by the balcony. A new exit sign will be placed by the door to the stairwell.
3. Sealing off a small opening to the crawl space where stray cats have been getting in under the house. The opening will be filled with Kwik Crete and rebar to prevent the cats from getting under the house. There are small grates that have been removed or kicked in around the foundation. If the grates are still under the house, they will be reinstalled.

Donation(s) are requested to add 5 large plastic bins with lids to our storage capacity. We cannot use cardboard boxes for storage anymore. The boxes and paper goods have made excellent nesting material for rodents and rodents in the building can do significant damage. The stray cats are not doing their job in rodent control (and we are evicting them too!)


## Woman's Club Fiesta Medal News



# A Commitment to Advancing Education in San Antonio

Our Club offers fun events and activities with luncheons, traditions and Round Tables. And since its founding the work of the Club is carried out to meet our objectives toward the “mutual improvement and cooperation in all that pertains to the greater good of humanity.” With the help of members and Club publications, highlights of the group’s service in the area of education from the Club’s beginning to our June general meeting when we recognized 2021 scholars are shared below.

Some of the Club’s earliest contributions to the advancement of public education in San Antonio include organizing Mother’s Clubs (now called Parent Teacher Associations) in local schools. Through the early work of our Woman’s Club, Home Economics and other arts instruction were added to local school curriculums.

The first scholarship established at the University of Texas Medical School, Galveston, was the "San Antonio Woman's Club Scholarship". This scholarship, established in 1904 and named in honor of Eleanor Brackenridge’s mother, was given annually to a woman medical student.

The Woman's Club of San Antonio has been a source of support for all education levels. Scholarships began for students at San Antonio College (SAC) at least half a century ago as noted in meeting minutes submitted with the Historical Designation Application submitted for the Woodward House in 1975. This support evolved in focus based on funding and need. For the past ten years SWANS (Services to Women in Non-traditional Programs) has been the recipient of \$10,000 from the Woman’s Club. This money supports 10 SWANS scholarships.

We can be proud of members who have given their time and money for education through our Club. To share a few examples of individual giving: member Carol Lee Jones donated funds to the Club’s scholarship efforts since at least 2002. Her 2010 estate established several perennial bequests including support of the WCSA annual scholarships. The annual bequest amount varies but our Club has ensured the SWANS received \$10,000 each year. When member Laura Sistrunk died, it was her wish that funds the club made from the sale of her personal estate items were part of the Alamo College donation increasing the amount given to SWANS to \$11,000 that year. With Club individual member and group funding efforts, over \$100,000 has been added to education access for women at San Antonio College in the past decade.

Another program at SAC, The Rising Star Program, is for the students who are completing GED requirements. For the two years prior to COVID restrictions, Helen Henderson and Ferne Burney have sponsored luncheons at the Woodward Mansion to honor students who had completed the GED program, many now working towards completing a college degree. Ferne has also presented seminars at the Empowerment Center at SAC in the areas of time management and priority management. New opportunities to tutor and mentor students at our neighboring San Antonio College are ever present.



As a Club tradition, a memorial of at least \$10 is directed to the scholarship fund in honor of each deceased member. Member Michael Quintanilla shared a new way he supports schools ~ Mobile Fiesta Exhibits with decked out vans. The school visits include hat making classes and a runway show with kids.

Dr. Helen Vera, Director of Services for Women & Non-traditional Students, prepared a booklet of our past scholars and introducing our 2021 scholarship recipients at San Antonio College. The following is taken from that booklet:


