Astoria Drainage Improvements

The drainage improvements construction project will be starting in the next couple of weeks on Astoria Lane. This project will reduce traffic to one lane. Please remember to be cautious of construction workers and equipment.

Yard Waste/Cardboard Recycle Site

With the possibility of a snowy October the City has decided to provide the yard waste and cardboard containers until the end of the month. They will return this spring as soon as the snow is gone and everyone's yardwork is able to commence again.



Planning and Development Update:

Polaris of the Black Hills has broken ground on their new 18,000 square foot building that includes a showroom, shop and offices. The post frame building has started to go up and they are projecting to be open in November/December.

O'Reilly Auto Parts is putting the finishing touches on their new Summerset location and are planning on an October 10th grand opening.

Summerset Waste Water Treatment Plant filter and SBR cover project is completed. RCS Construction has a few minor items on the punch list to wrap up. This project will help to ensure that our plant is running at maximum efficiency and protecting the environment for generations to come.

Sun Valley Estates

The developer has presented an addition of the development at the end of Telluride Street. The plans have been submitted to the City and the review process is in the works.







Code Enforcement

Well, it's that time of year again... snow will be starting to fall any day. To ensure everyone is up to date on the Snow Removal Ordinance, I thought I would include a few of the main points of the ordinance that residents should be aware of. Thank you for your continued cooperation.

18.01.04 NO PARKING ON SNOW ROUTES. No person may park or allow to remain parked any vehicle or trailer on any street designated as Emergency Snow Route or Secondary Snow Route during snowfall or prior to the time said

street is cleared of snow by the City. Vehicles or trailers parked on snow routes in violation of this section may be ticketed and/or towed at the owner's expense. Violations of this chapter shall be subject to the fine established by City Resolution.

18.01.05 DEPOSITING DEBRIS IN PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY. It is unlawful for any person to shovel or deposit snow or ice, leaves, material or other substances of any kind and description from private property onto any public street, alley or public right-of-way. Such conduct or action is declared to be a nuisance.

18.02.01: PUBLIC NUISANCE Snow and ice permitted to gather and remain upon the sidewalks of this City is dangerous to the safety of its citizens and others using said sidewalks and is hereby declared a public nuisance. 18.02.02: REMOVAL BY OWNER The owner or occupant of any building or any lot, parcel or plot of ground fronting or abutting on any sidewalk in the snow removal are hereinafter described, shall clear said sidewalk of snow or ice to the full width of the sidewalk within 24 hours after the same shall have fallen or

formed. The Public Works Department of the City may waive this requirement in the event of an extended snowstorm.


