Lady Medina Investigations was founded in 2006 as a Private Investigation Agency. The first contract my company received was almost immediate as a Field Investigator for the MPAA. Six months later, Lady Medina Investigations received a phone call from RIAA

requesting our services based on a referral from the Motion Pictures Association of America. RIAA was seeking a female investigator to add to their team of field investigators.

Before arriving to the state of Florida, my background experience was in Law Enforcement in New York City where my security experience was gained as an officer at the Rikers Island Correctional Facility. My investigation experience came from working in the Special Operations Division.

After five (5) years of being in business with a Private Investigation Agency my Security license was achieved.



Lady Medina Investigations then received a contract as a sub-contractor in Miami with FDOT in Southwest Florida-District 1. In 2013, the name of the company was changed to Apogee Security & Investigation Services, LLC.

After many attempts in trying to secure a security guard contract, we decided to apply for DBE certification in the state of Florida and approved in September 2016.

The CEI/DBE Supportive Services program has been hands on with my company since the approval of our DBE certification.
