

BY LAWS OF THE Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc. Article VII Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians). and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- * Triune God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- * Creation and Formation
- * Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- * Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life
- * Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul, and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
- * Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
- * Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- * Washing of feet
- * Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- * Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- * Destruction of the wicked
- Conditional Immortality
- * Rapture of the Man Child Class
- * Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
- * A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

I attended your church this morning, You wouldn't remember me... may be eleven or eighty but I was there.... And I was hunting for something......I think I almost found it.... I think I would have if you hadn't been in such a hurry.

The choir...even you in the congregation....sang hymns about a loving Lord that made my heart beat faster... I felt a tight, choking sensation in my throat as your Pastor described the condition of a lost person.

"I am lost. He is talking about me" I said to myself.

"From the way he speaks, being saved must be very important." I looked about at you in the pews near me... you were listening... you seemed to think the Pastors words were important. All these people are so concerned, I thought, they want me to be saved too."

At last the Pastor finished his appeal and asked you to stand and sing another of the beautiful songs that you know so well. I swallowed a lump in my throat and wished I knew the joy with which you sang. Then your Pastor looked at me and started telling me once again how I could have this joy... but his words were drowned in a buzzing beside me..


When I glanced around you were putting on your little girls coat and telling her to get her things, I looked on my other side and saw you touching up your lipstick and rearranging your hair.

Looking in front of me, I saw you frown at your watch as if time were running out. Suddenly I didn't want to look at more of you,- my eyes burned and my throat hurt.... my feet were so tired I couldn't have walked toward the pleading minister.

You didn't really care, This salvation the Pastor had been telling me about was not important, you only wanted to get away.

I wanted to get away too.... I wanted to run.... But I was afraid if I did you would wonder what I was hunting for.

I waited until the service was over and walked out among you...alone...LOST.


The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: He leadeth me beside the still waters.

My First Ministry Experience-by Fred Huff



It was the summer of 1965. I was 16 years old and my brother Dennis was 18. We were both Christians and had been invited to help with the "gospel work" that summer. Our pastor in Midwest City, was Brother Harold Bollinger. He encouraged us to accept the invitation and offer ourselves as servants of the Lord.

Our father, Wayne Huff was naturally concerned for our safety, but he encouraged us also. Dad had been a "gospel worker" as a young man himself. He made a generous contribution to our work by letting us drive his best car for the summer. It was a sleek, black Studebaker Hawk with a 289 V8 engine and a 3 speed transmission with overdrive. It got great gas mileage for such a sporty car. Now that I am older, I appreciate more fully the sacrifice Dad made to help us. Not only did he give up his favorite car. He took over all the yard work and other chores that Dennis and I usually did.

Our first stop was in Shattuck. OK to help Bro. L.J. Ehrlich start a new church. There was plenty of cleaning, painting and yard work to do. I remember being scared while painting the church steeple. I got the assignment because I was the tallest, I had never been afraid of heights, but this was different. I stood on that steep roof, on a step ladder, while reaching up as high as I could, struggling to paint the top of that steeple in the Oklahoma wind. Two ropes were tied around my waist, Brother L.J. was on the ground holding the rope on one side of the church while Dennis held the rope on the other side. I'm thankful that we never had to test those emergency measures, and I was very happy when the job was done. By the way, I have never painted another steeple and certainly don't plan to ever do it again.

The next stop I remember was in Baptist Ford, AR, where Brother and Sister Alfred Whitely were pastors. I played the guitar and sang and Dennis preached. The Whiteleys and their church people were very kind to us. Next we stopped at Cave Springs, AR where a young couple, Roland and Loretta Haney were pastors. We really enjoyed spending time with them and their two little boys. I remember pushing Marty on the swings. He was just a little guy then. They were kind enough to let us minister to their congregation. The people were so friendly and the food was wonderful. We left Cave Springs heading for the camp in Pine Crest, MS. What a trip! It seemed like we seldom got above 40 miles per hour on those curvy AR roads. By the time we got close to the camp, it was late at night. We had never been there but we noticed on the map that the camp was near Hinton, AL I remember Dennis saying that if we missed the camp we could get a motel in Hinton. We had a good laugh about that later. All we saw in Hinton was two mailboxes on the highway.

I will never forget getting out of the car at the Pine Crest Camp. We were deep in the woods, but the night calls from the birds and crickets made a deafening roar. I was raised under the Tinker Air Force Base flight pattern, but I never expected to hear a roar like that deep in the woods.

This was my 1st experience as a Youth Camp Counselor. My group consisted of 8 nine year old boys. They were eager to learn and I was eager to teach what little I knew. We had lots of fun, but also spent plenty of time in prayer together and talking about God's Word. It was wonderful to see nearly all those boys seeking God at the altar that week.

I shared with them the things I had learned from the Bible and told them the stories of how God had worked in my life. They also enjoyed hearing me play the guitar and singing some of the songs I had written, I always encouraged them to go to the altar with me and pray after each service. I tried to help them understand that God loved each one of them and wanted to touch their lives, as He had touched mine. One night, after all the boys but one finished praying, they were restless and wanted to go back to the dorm. After about 30 minutes, I felt I should go check on him. I was wearing a white shirt and white jeans, which were to become part of this story. Most of the lights were off in the tabernacle, but I could see the young man still praying at the altar. I walked down one side of the tabernacle and sat at the end of the altar about 50 feet from where the boy was. While I prayed for him quietly, I heard an uproar form the boys dorm, so I quietly got up, walked around the end of the tabernacle and went back to the dorm. In just a few minutes, the boy who had been praying came running into the dorm shouting, "Bro. Fred! Brother Fred! I just saw an angel!

After he quieted down a little, I asked him to tell me what he saw. He said he was praying and asked God to show him a "sign". The next thing he knew he saw a figure, dressed in all white, walk into the tabernacle, sit on the altar and pray for him. Then the figure just got up and walked away. He was so excited that I just didn't know whether to tell the "angel" he saw was only me, in my white shirt and jeans. But he had given his heart to Jesus and I was very thankful for that. I have thought about that incident many times through the years. It occurs to me that we never know how our actions may affect someone else. I know that little boy saw me, not an angel, that night. But I also know that what he saw seemed like an answer to prayer for him.

Did God use me that moment to be a "ministering spirit" to that little boy? It could be. The memory of that event makes me want to be careful to follow every prompting of the Holy Spirit. None of us knows when God might use us to be the answer to someone's prayer.

I was really impressed with what it meant to be in the deep woods of Mississippi in June. It seemed to cloud up and rain every afternoon. Sometimes it rained hard, but only for a few minutes. When the rain stopped, you could see steam rising all around. The rain kept things damp, but it didn't cool us off at all. Later in life, while pasturing the church in Balko, OK I though several times about how nice one of those afternoon thunderstorms would feel there.

One afternoon during youth camp, Brother Lowell Long, who had a farm nearby, brought a pickup load of watermelons for the campers. I never saw kids have any more fun eating watermelons than they did that day.

Brother Jerome and Sister Peggy Crowhurst were living at Pine Crest at that time and Brother and Sister George Hindergart were the pastors at the nearby Hinton Church. I have never met any people who worked harder or prayed more faithfully than those 4 wonderful people. Many of the vegetables that were served at the camp were grown in the large garden by the Crowhurst's hose. I remember the tomatoes, beans and squash as being especially tasty. Once, just after a meal one of the men from the community asked me, "So, how do you like goat meat?" I told him I had never eaten goat meat. He just laughed and said, "That's what you had for supper!" Maybe I didn't notice because of the spices but the meal tasted very good to me.

The 2nd week of camp was called Camp Meeting. It was for adults as well as kids. I must confess something that embarrasses me every time I think of it, even today. I had been playing the guitar for about 4 years and I thought I was doing well with it. I had even learned to do a little picking while strumming the chords with a song. The camp directors were kind enough to ask me to sing during the services often. Then one night a local group came to sing at camp. They played gospel music with a heavy bluegrass/country flavor. I enjoyed their "foot stomping" style of music but thought to myself that their guitar music was simple. Naturally I preferred my style to theirs. After the service a young man from our dorm ran up to me and said, "Bro. Fred, if you practice a lot Maybe someday you will be able to play like those guys!" I learned 2 lessons that day. First, we don't all have the same taste in music, and that's ok. Second, nothing can deflate the ego of a teenager quicker than the honest opinion of a child. Those lessons have helped me not to take myself too seriously through the years. God uses each of us and the gifts and talents He has given us. When I just share with others what the Lord has given me and trust God for the results, everything works out just fine.

After the camps were over, Bro. Jim Arnall invited my brother and me, along with the newlyweds, Earl and Carol Malone, to come to their church at Pine Hill, AL for a revival. That was an amazing experience. Dennie and Bro. Earl took turns preaching and Sis. Carol and I helped with the music. I was amazed at how big the crowds were. Everyone treated us like celebrities, and the Spirit of the Lord touched hearts every night. Bro. & Sis. Arnall were wonderful hosts. They took such good care of their 4 guests along with their 2 young children, Kayla and Steve. The meals were outstanding. I don't know how she managed that large group the way she did. If I remember right they were living in a travel trailer behind the church and a lot of our meals were served on a picnic table. I became good friends with their son Steve that summer. He was 6 years old and was learning to play baseball. I spent a lot of time pitching the ball to him. It's amazing to remember how we got to know each other. Steve and Cathy had 3 beautiful daughters and 13 grandchildren. It's a good thing Steve learned to entertain form his parents. He certainly raised a family to love the Lord. Many times I have seen Steve as a 6 year old in the faces of his grandchildren. God took care of me & my brother that summer. We met people I will never forget. Looking back at what happened 60 years ago, I am so thankful for God's mercy and grace and the opportunities He has given me to minister to His people.
