Why Is Lordship Necessary?

I. It settles the position issue. (Who is #1 in my life?)

A. Understanding and embracing the Lordship settles the position issue. >>What do I mean?

"Then He poured water into the basin, and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel with which He was girded. So He came to Simon Peter. He said to Him, "Lord, do You wash my feet?" Jesus answered and said to him, "What I do you do not realize now, but you will understand hereafter." (John 13:5-7)

1. How do we stop being position conscious?

B. Jesus was not "position conscious". *Why*?

"During supper, ... Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He had come forth from God and was going back to God, got up from supper, and laid aside His garments; and taking a towel, He girded Himself." (**John 13:2-4**)

- 1. He knew what he possessed.
- 2. He knew who He was.
- 3. He knew where He was going.

C. Pride keeps people from settling the Lordship of Christ.

1. Satan never settled the Lordship issue: He invented pride and infect the world with it.

"But you said in your heart, 'I will ascend to heaven; I will raise my throne above the stars of God, And I will sit on the mount of assembly In the recesses of the north. 'I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will make myself like the Most High.' " (Isaiah 14:12-14)

2. Adam and Eve were deceived into believing Lordship was not necessary:

"⁴ The serpent said to the woman, "You surely will not die! "For God knows that in the day you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." " (Genesis 3:1-5)

- II. God is to be Lord in four particular areas:
 - A. In our salvation. (Romans 10:9)
 - B. In our everyday life. (Romans 12:11)
 - C. In our business. (Colossians 3:23-24)
 - D. In our family. (Ephesians 5:22,25)
- III. It settles the permission issue. (Who has a right to my life?)

Three people interacted with Jesus concerning lordship...

A. Lordship requires three hard decisions: (Luke 9:57-62)

1. Accepting the future regardless of the cost v57-58

"As they were going along the road, someone said to Him, "I will follow You wherever You go." And Jesus said to him, "The foxes have holes and the birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay His head."

2. Seizing the moment regardless of the pull of others $_{\rm V59-60}$

And He said to another, "Follow Me." But he said, "Lord, permit me first to go and bury my father." But He said to him, "Allow the dead to bury their own dead; but as for you, go and proclaim everywhere the kingdom of God."

3. Leaving the past regardless of the inconvenience v61-62

Another also said, "I will follow You, Lord; but first permit me to say good-bye to those at home." But Jesus said to him, "No one, after putting his hand to the plow and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God."

B. Observations:

- 1. Not everyone is ready for lordship.
- 2. Lordship is more than words its action.
- 3. Jesus always sees our heart.
- 4. Lordship forces us to change... to choose.

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
