JESUS CHALLENGES US TO BE GOOD DISCIPLES

Jesus' words to the crowds are difficult to hear. The demands He makes of His disciples are too much. Hate your family? Carry your own cross? Renounce all your possessions? They range



from unreasonable to unthinkable. Can He possibly mean to be so harsh? First, consider that the use of the Greek misei for hating one's family could well be an example of semitic hyberbole, intended to shock when "reject," not "hate" could be more appropriate. Secondly, renouncing all possessions doesn't necessarily mean leaving one-self destitute, but no longer regarding what you have as your own property. To follow Jesus means to choose Jesus, who gives us everything we need,

even the promise of eternal life, over those things most dear to us: our families, our homes, our wealth, and all our "stuff." Let us look to His first disciples: the twelve apostles. They left their families, their homes, and their possessions, choosing to live a difficult lifestyle instead. Every day they calculated the cost of discipleship and concluded that following Jesus was worth everything they gave up.

It may still be difficult to understand why we can't have both. Let us consider the question in Wisdom: "Who can conceive what the Lord intends?" (Wisdom 9:13). God's ways may seem foolish or shocking to our limited imaginations, but we are asked to trust in God, to accept that God's wisdom is greater than we can conceive.

Saint Paul asks his convert Philemon to do something radical and selfless: to welcome back Onesimus, who ran away and found Christ, and accept him not as a slave but as a brother. Onesimus, whom Paul trusted to return to Philemon and deliver this letter, could have kept running rather than take the chance that Philemon would ignore the letter and re-enslave him. The fact that this letter not only survived but became part of the Bible implies that Philemon kept it and agreed to Paul's appeal.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS Where's the Sacrifice?

"It's not that I want you to do it. It's that I want you to want to do it."

If you're married or in a relationship, your partner has probably either said something like this to you or you have said it to them. If one of you hasn't said it, you have probably wanted to, and it's likely that a big argument or two was had where you dance around the sentiment, these exact words flashing in your mind like an old-time movie marquee.

The "it" never really matters much. Taking out the trash, painting the bedroom, traveling to your in-laws' for Christmas — whatever the subject matter of the disagreement is, it's all just so much set dressing. The heart of the matter is the sacrifice and desire. That's what it all hangs on. Am I with a person who will sacrifice for me?

When Paul writes to Philemon that he is sending Onesimus to him, he says exactly this. He tells Philemon that he would prefer to keep Onesimus with him, but that he does not want to deprive Philemon both of Onesimus and the opportunity to make a sacrifice worthy in the sight of the Lord.

The point is not who gets to hang out with Onesimus. The point is, as it says in the Gospel, who is willing to carry his cross? Who is willing to renounce his possessions? Who is willing to do the good deed for the sake of the other?

God doesn't care that much about what we have to offer. He cares much more that we have the strength to offer whatever we have.
