### Fr. Larry's Reflection...

Reflection for 14<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time July 6, 2025

Independence Day is always a good time to reflect on the meaning of freedom, especially as we strive to live Gospel values in challenging times. Often when we think of freedom we think of freedom "from" something. That is certainly what the 4<sup>th</sup> of July is all about—freedom from the tyranny of a king, freedom from unfair taxation, freedom from colonization. That understanding of freedom is important and valid; it is the hope of so many people in our world who desire to be free from poverty, warfare, discrimination or oppression. The Gospel of Jesus challenges us to create a world where all of free from injustice. The second sense of freedom is freedom "for" something. This is the freedom that allows us to pursue our goals without restriction. Here too the founding values of our nation are relevant. The Declaration of Independence asserts that we have been endowed by our creator "with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." We are free to pursue happiness. This is very consistent with our Catholic understanding of freedom that roots our free will in God's desire that we freely choose love, freely do good, and freely choose the eternal life God offers us (happiness). Let us pray this 4<sup>th</sup> of July weekend that we will always use our freedom for the good, as individuals and as a nation.

### St. Michael Prayer, *Explained!*

The prayer to St. Michael invokes the protection of the archangel Michael in the ongoing spiritual battle for the souls of all mankind. This prayer was composed by Pope Leo XIII and its use was instituted in 1886 at the end of Low Mass, a tradition which continued until the liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council. A popular story regarding its origin claims that the Pope wrote this prayer after having a vision of demonic spirits descending on Rome.

Michael is mentioned as one of God's seven archangels in the Book of Enoch and is presented by Revelations 12:7-12 as the warrior angel who cast Satan from heaven. He is therefore traditionally venerated as a protector against the forces of evil and a guardian of the Church. The Prayer to St. Michael is still commonly said at the end of the rosary and by some parishes after the conclusion of Mass.
