Thanks again to everyone for their support and we look forward to seeing you in March.



# From the Bridge

From The Bridge February, 2014

Hello Everyone



I can't believe Opening Day is only 2 1/2 months away. I have already begun doing my good weather dance - it worked so well last year, why not try again!

We haven't been able to get down to Ohana for the past 5 weeks, but I did today. Started both main engines, the generator, cleaned the head and holding tank and measured for some new trim pieces, new carpeting and cushions. I have already ordered the spare parts I restock each year and the regular things, like flares, new holding tank breathing filter, and holding tank deodorizer tablets. Ohana gives Linda and I a very clear vibe - she does not like sitting around without us or under cover. I know it sounds hokey, but things get dicey if she doesn't get to run - the gremlins come aboard and do nasties.

I had ordered a small part to re-hang our ships bell just before my surgery from Fisheries. Frankly, this is a part that they would normally have in stock and on display had the recession not come about. Their floor and inventory in General is way down. That's not just their choice - many suppliers are not making small batches of parts anymore - they accumulate orders and then make large batches, thus saving labor and material inventory costs. However, Fisheries has gone through a huge change in employees, particularly downstairs. The new people just don't gave the same level of knowledge. Example - I got a call from Fisheries about two weeks ago saying my part was in at will-call. When I went to will-call this morning, they couldn't find a thing - under my name, WSYC, or my mechanics account. I left really pissed, to be honest. I went upstairs to get another part, told them what had happened, and she found it in two minutes. Not good.

Anyway, there are some significant changes to the boating community recently. Bob Picot Upholstery has shut down. Second Wave is shutting down in late May or June. Boat Electric has moved down to Nickerson Street by the Ballard Bridge. There are many rumors of some boat dealers being on the brink of collapse. That may surprise many, but the only thing selling right now on a strong basis, are the custom or mega yachts. Also, there are fewer and fewer reliable mechanics and service facilities around.

I don't say this to be negative. The industry has always been volatile, but it seems more precarious right now. The good news is that we live in this amazing water play land and within a half a day or so, we can find a place to dock and socialize, or a place to anchor and be as far away from the crowd as we choose. Fuel prices are not much different than last year and marinas are all making improvements in wifi, their docks, stores, etc.

We have a great meeting coming up with The Crab Feed (Get your plate full before Rod Ruprecht) and we should gave a great turn out.

Let's get ready to cherish this coming season safely and with "vigor"!
