Brunner Farmhouse & Gardens

The yellow house on the hill at the corner of Midway and Main is a little-known gem in Broomfield.



The Brunner Farmhouse and Gardens comes alive in the spring to late fall with beautiful perennial gardens, The Olson Vegetable teaching gardens, walking paths, outdoor space for meditation, activities and events. It also has the restored 1908 farmhouse.

Wonderful volunteers

A community of committed and faithful volunteer “worker bees” come together to make sure the Broomfield community enjoys the crescendo of spring blooming that will take ones’ breath away. Working with Broomfield Master Gardeners, these volunteers keep the gardens manicured until it’s time to put them to bed in October.

Local generosity

In 2022, a generous gift from local Broomfield business Olson Landscaping Co. provided teaching vegetable beds.

The Master Gardeners developed a curriculum for children, adults, seniors, and the disabled community. Special features in the Sensory Garden include plants to be touched, tasted and smelled.

A solar-powered fountain provides visual delight as the water drops to a splash. There’s a bed for horticultural research and a bed managed by youth volunteers. A tool and equipment shed was built through a Community & Gardens partnership with Broomfield High School’s construction class. The excitement is growing as garden volunteers, Master Gardeners, and community partners come together to polish the “gem” on the hill.

Broomfield Spellbinders

Broomfield Spellbinders storytellers have shared stories in local school classrooms and senior care facilities for 25 years. Aspen resident and Spellbinders founder Germaine Dietsch established local groups (chapters) throughout Colorado and beyond, including a group at the Broomfield Senior Center starting the summer of 2001.

BCAH adopted the local Spellbinders group 15 years ago, and it continues to thrive as a BCAH program.

During the 2024-25 school year, Broomfield Spellbinders storytellers visited 122 classrooms in 19 schools once each month for 30-minute sessions, sharing classic folk tales, legends, and a variety of modern stories. Young listeners welcome them like “rock stars,” and members say that these intergenerational visits keep them mentally sharp.


Come Blow Your Horn


