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Hotel Floor Plan

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

GASTROSCOPY STANDARDS



Catherine Dubé

Dr. Dubé is currently the Clinical Lead for ColonCancerCheck, Ontario's colorectal cancer screening program. She is a gastroenterologist who obtained her Medical Degree from the University of Montréal in 1989, where she also completed a Master's degree in pharmacology (1990). She completed her fellowships in Internal Medicine (1993) and Gastroenterology (1995) as well as a Master's degree in Clinical Epidemiology (1999) at the University of Ottawa. She was Associate Clinical Professor of Medicine at the University of Calgary from 2006-2013 and is currently a Staff Physician at The Ottawa Hospital and an Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of Ottawa.

Dr. Dubé has been a member of the steering committee for the CAG's Endoscopy Quality Program, leading to the CAGs consensus on Quality in Endoscopy, published in 2012. As part of this program, she has chaired and presented several workshops to various professional groups on quality and patient-centered care in endoscopy as well as the use of the Endoscopy Global rating Scale (GRS). She participated with colleagues and experts to the creation of the Canadian version of the GRS (C-GRS) and led the Canadian Association of Gastroenterology's initiative to implement and support its use in endoscopy units across Canada. Dr. Dubé was Medical Lead for the Alberta Colorectal Cancer (CRC) Screening program from 2011-2013, where she led the implementation of the fecal immunochemical test (FIT). She also participated in the work of the Canadian Partnership Against Cancer (CPAC) to define pan-Canadian quality determinants for CRC screening programs.

OVERVIEW:

This presentation will cover the highlights of Cancer Care Ontario's "Gastroscopy Standards and Quality Indicators for Ontario" which were recently completed through a systematic review of the literature on gastroscopy standards and input from an expert panel.

Dr. Danial Schecter

Dr. Danial Schecter is co-founder of the Cannabinoid Medical Clinic (CMClinic) and a practicing family physician. After working alongside some of Canada's leading researchers in the field of medical cannabis, Dr. Schecter developed a strong interest in the therapeutic use of cannabinoids. As a recognized medical expert in the field of prescription cannabinoids and medical cannabis, Dr. Schecter has given numerous presentations to fellow physicians and developed educational programs on this subject. Dr. Schecter spearheaded the creation of the Patient Handbook on Medical Cannabis used by many organizations as a patient education tool. In addition to cannabinoid medicine, Dr. Schecter's clinical interests include delivering a high standard of care to at risk elderly and palliative care patients, prompting him to establish his own house-calls service in Georgian Bay, ON. Along with his other clinical duties Dr. Schecter continues to be an active hospitalist at the Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre in Barrie, ON.Hospital Affiliation: Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre, Barrie (ON)

OVERVIEW:

An increasing number of patients are using cannabis and cannabinoids both therapeutically and recreationally. This presentation will focus on the impact that this has on gastroenterologists and General Surgeons to review a few key clinical considerations including cannabis induced hyperemesis and potential impact on endoscopy.
