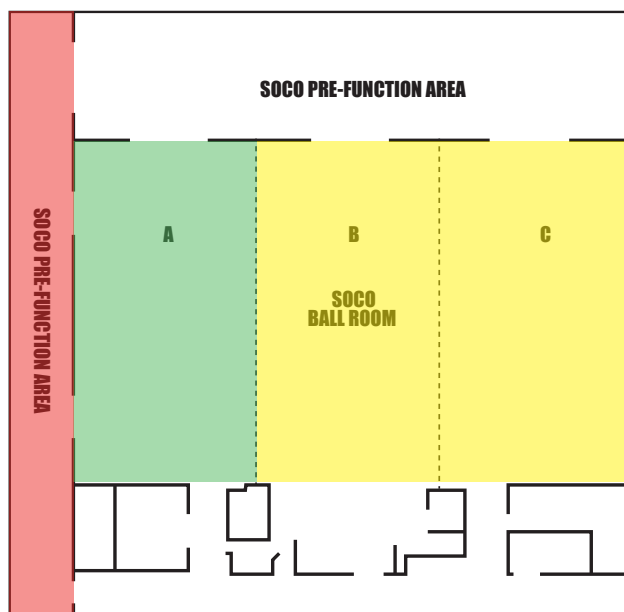

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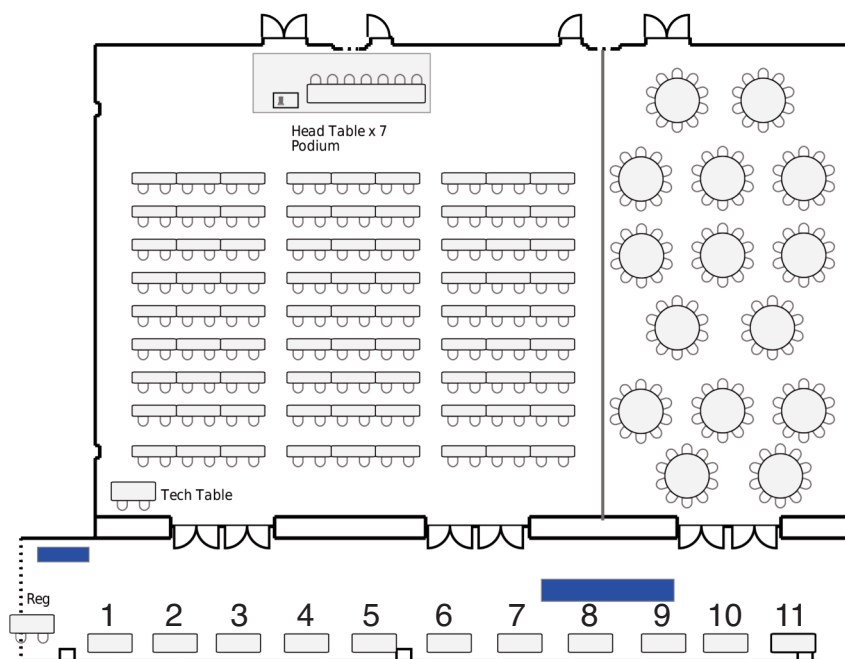
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Hotel Floor Plan

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GASTROSCOPY STANDARDS



Catherine Dubé

Dr. Dubé is currently the Clinical Lead for ColonCancerCheck, Ontario's colorectal cancer screening program. She is a gastroenterologist who obtained her Medical Degree from the University of Montréal in 1989, where she also completed a Master's degree in pharmacology (1990). She completed her fellowships in Internal Medicine (1993) and Gastroenterology (1995) as well as a Master's degree in Clinical Epidemiology (1999) at the University of Ottawa. She was Associate Clinical Professor of Medicine at the University of Calgary from 2006-2013 and is currently a Staff Physician at The Ottawa Hospital and an Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of Ottawa.

Dr. Dubé has been a member of the steering committee for the CAG's Endoscopy Quality Program, leading to the CAGs consensus on Quality in Endoscopy, published in 2012. As part of this program, she has chaired and presented several workshops to various professional groups on quality and patient-centered care in endoscopy as well as the use of the Endoscopy Global rating Scale (GRS). She participated with colleagues and experts to the creation of the Canadian version of the GRS (C-GRS) and led the Canadian Association of Gastroenterology's initiative to implement and support its use in endoscopy units across Canada. Dr. Dubé was Medical Lead for the Alberta Colorectal Cancer (CRC) Screening program from 2011-2013, where she led the implementation of the fecal immunochemical test (FIT). She also participated in the work of the Canadian Partnership Against Cancer (CPAC) to define pan-Canadian quality determinants for CRC screening programs.

OVERVIEW:

This presentation will cover the highlights of Cancer Care Ontario's "Gastroscopy Standards and Quality Indicators for Ontario" which were recently completed through a systematic review of the literature on gastroscopy standards and input from an expert panel.

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Medical Marijuana and Prescription Cannabinoids: Options or Barrier for GI Health



Dr. Danial Schechter

Dr. Danial Schechter is co-founder of the Cannabinoid Medical Clinic (CMClinic) and a practicing family physician. After working alongside some of Canada's leading researchers in the field of medical cannabis, Dr. Schechter developed a strong interest in the therapeutic use of cannabinoids. As a recognized medical expert in the field of prescription cannabinoids and medical cannabis, Dr. Schechter has given numerous presentations to fellow physicians and developed educational programs on this subject. Dr. Schechter spearheaded the creation of the Patient Handbook on Medical Cannabis used by many organizations as a patient education tool. In addition to cannabinoid medicine, Dr. Schechter's clinical interests include delivering a high standard of care to at risk elderly and palliative care patients, prompting him to establish his own house-calls service in Georgian Bay, ON. Along with his other clinical duties Dr. Schechter continues to be an active hospitalist at the Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre in Barrie, ON. Hospital Affiliation: Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre, Barrie (ON)

OVERVIEW:

An increasing number of patients are using cannabis and cannabinoids both therapeutically and recreationally. This presentation will focus on the impact that this has on gastroenterologists and General Surgeons to review a few key clinical considerations including cannabis induced hyperemesis and potential impact on endoscopy.



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Perforations from Colonoscopy: Prevention and Management



Dr. Stan Feinberg

Dr. Stan Feinberg is a Colorectal Surgeon on staff at North York General Hospital where he is also the Medical Program Director for Cancer Care and Ambulatory Care. Dr. Feinberg trained at the University of Toronto and the Cleveland Clinic Foundation.

Dr. Feinberg is the Associate Program Director for General Surgery at U of T. He is also an examiner for the Royal College.

OVERVIEW:

This will focus on prevention, early detection and appropriate management. Which cases are suitable for conservative management and which need surgery.



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Guidelines for Management of Anticoagulation for Elective Endoscopy



Dr. Chris Teshima

Christopher Teshima attended medical school at the University of Toronto, completed residency training in Internal Medicine at U of T, and then trained in Gastroenterology at the University of Alberta, where he also did a research fellowship leading to a Masters degree in Clinical Epidemiology. He then pursued an Advanced Endoscopy Fellowship at Erasmus MC University Medical Centre in The Netherlands in 2009 and 2010, where he continued research resulting in a PhD.

He then joined the Division of Gastroenterology as an Assistant Professor at the University of Alberta in 2010, where he became director of the Therapeutic Endoscopy Training Program in 2013. Earlier this year he moved to Toronto to join the Therapeutic Endoscopy group at St Michael's Hospital. His clinical interests focus on upper GI neoplasia, endoscopic mucosal resection, endoscopic therapy for pancreatic pseudocysts and walled-off necrosis, Zenkers diverticulum, small bowel endoscopy for obscure GI bleeding, and endoscopic ultrasound.

OVERVIEW:

1. To review the recently updated ASGE and European guidelines for the peri-procedure management of blood thinners, including the new NOACs.
2. To summarize an algorithm for the management of patients on anticoagulation coming for elective endoscopy



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Endoscopic Techniques for Prevention and Management of Bleeding in Clinics

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Fit Testing – What The Endoscopist Needs To Know

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PRESIDENT



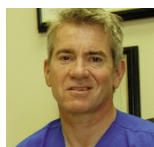
