ORDINANCE NO. 95 - 35

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING WEIGHT LIMITS
FOR MOTOR VEHICLES ON ROADWAYS
WITHIN MARION TOWNSHIP, CENTRE COUNTY, PA

WHEREAS, there are certain streets and roads within Marion Township which are not constructed to sustain heavy loads; and,

WHEREAS, the Marion Township Board of Supervisors, in order to advance the welfare and safety of the residents of the Township and such other persons who use said streets and roads, deems it necessary to enact weight limitations on certain streets and roads in Marion Township; and

WHEREAS, the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania provides for the establishing of weight limits on streets and roads; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors, after completing engineering and traffic studies of the following streets and roads, find the following weight limits to be warranted in accordance with the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, and it is enacted and ordained, by the Board of Supervisors of Marion Township, as follows:

Section 1: The maximum weight limit for the following streets and roads is hereby established as follows:

<u>STREET OR ROAD</u>	<u>BETWEEN</u>	<u>WEIGHT LIMIT (lbs)</u>
1. Walnut Ridge Rd.	End of pavement to S.R. 26	10 ton
2. Rabbit Hill Road	Walnut Ridge Rd. and end of pavement	10 ton

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall be enforced in accordance with the provisions of the Vehicle Code of Pennsylvania as it pertains to enforcement, fines and other penalties.

SECTION 3, There shall be procured all official signs required under any of the sections of this Ordinance or any future amendment hereof or additions hereto; and which shall be erected, posted and maintained so as to properly give effect to the provisions of all of the sections of this Ordinance and properly to comply with law, including the requirements set forth in the rules and regulations of the Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

SECTION 4. Any provisions of any prior Ordinance which may be in conflict with this Ordinance is hereby repealed only insofar as a conflict may exist.

SECTION 5. Should any provision of this Ordinance be found to be unconstitutional or otherwise illegal or in any manner unenforceable, the remaining sections of the Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall take effect five (5) days after enactment thereof.
