Dear Friends,

Thanks to the generosity of the Lutheran Church Extension Fund, Cristo Para Todas Las Naciones (the Hispanic Ministry of the District), and All Saints' Lutheran Church in Guadalajara, I am able to spend three weeks in Mexico improving my Spanish and gaining a fuller understanding of Hispanic cultures. While I have learned a lot of Spanish on my own, an immersion experience will help me tremendously in conversing with others in Spanish. Additionally, in order to effectively serve others it is important to have an appreciation of their culture and values. Since a majority of our neighbors who are Hispanic are originally from Mexico, my time in Guadalajara will be very beneficial in serving our neighbors who are Hispanic. While I am away, the Elders will be providing oversight in the congregation and will be taking the Lord's Supper to many of our homebound members. In addition, Pastor Eddy of Messiah Church will be providing emergency pastoral care to our members. The telephone number at Messiah is (608) 365-4724. Pastor Randy Senn will be leading worship on the first three Sundays in September (Sept 10, 17, and 24). Since I am taking vacation time to cover the weeks that I am away, there will be no additional cost to the congregation for my trip. I invite your prayers that this trip may be beneficial to our ministry here at St. John's.

My vision for St. John's is that we become again a congregation deeply rooted in the lives of our neighbors. Living in the Bluff/Vine/Liberty/Merrill neighborhood are many people who do not have a church home. Our mission is to reach them with the precious message of the Gospel of Christ Jesus. Our Sunday school is an important part of our outreach to our neighbors. During our Day Camp, I learned a lot about what is effective in engaging the children in our neighborhood and we are going to apply those lessons to the organization of our Sunday school program. Sunday school for the high school class will continue with the curriculum they used last year, since this worked so very well. For the preschool and elementary school students, we will begin with some songs which are very engaging and then participate in a video lesson from the What's in the Bible series by Phil Vischer. Following the video, the preschoolers will be taken to the nursery to color a picture which accompanies the lesson or to engage in free-play with the many toys in the nursery. After we have had some further discussion about the lesson with the elementary students, we will go out to the playground or the gym for some games. At 11:30 am, we will gather in the gym for lunch. We will be inviting members of the congregation to sign up for a Sunday during the school year to either provide lunch for the students or to cover the cost of the lunch. There are children in our neighborhood who are hungry. Some of

the elementary schools in our district have begun a program in which they send home food with students on Fridays to get them through the weekend. In this context, St. John's can give kids a Sunday lunch. I am convinced that telling people about the love of Jesus is most effective when it is accompanied by showing them the love of Jesus. Please pray for this outreach opportunity and ask me how you can help.

I am delighted to report that our congregation and that of Messiah Church will be offering joint catechism classes again this year. Our classes will be held on the second and fourth Monday evenings of each month from 6:00 to 7:30 pm. We will rotate locations as we did last year. The first class will be held on Monday, October 23, at 6:00 pm at Messiah Lutheran Church. All students in 6th through 8th grade are invited to participate.

We will have a booth at the Latino Community Fair to be held at the former Brother Dutton School on Saturday, September 30th, from 11am to 2pm. Admission is free. We hope that you will come check us out!

I've never done anything to her...never taken her seat. I suppose I'll have to come an hour early to get my seat. She took it because it's one of the best seats in the house. She had no business taking it...and I'm not going to church two hours early to get what's rightfully mine. This is the way social injustices begin—abusive people taking other people's seats. It's the way seeds of revolution are sown. A person can only stand so much. Where's it all going to end? If somebody doesn't stand up and be counted, nobody's seat will be safe. People will sit anywhere they please, and next time they'll take my parking place. World order will be in a shambles!" We smile, but it's amazing how quickly we get bent out of shape when our little routine is disrupted. Do you know why the Christian life is described as "the high calling"? (Philippians 3:14)? "I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." Because it means taking the high road and serving others, rather than taking the low road and putting ourselves first.
