### THAT DANG MONKEY IS BACK VICTOR CHAN



anuary's trip saw the return of new volunteers Roy Choi and Marilyn Gil, despite having as-

signed them to be our crash test dummies in the bi-ski in December. We welcomed our first students of the season: Chelsea Faulkner, Sean Sorenburger, and new student Matthew. Matthew's mother Jacqueline was so nice to bring excellent homemade tamales to share with everyone on the trip – what a treat!

Friday was a blue sky sunny day and Soo Lee, Glenn Green, Matt Horn, Kenny Chan and I started our day together scoping out Forest Trail and Mambo. Kenny was sporting a Vintage Unrecables jacket that Steve Lefkowitz gave to him. We searched for good snow as it had been warm the previous week with no new snow. Groomed runs were fine which suited speed demon Roy who later would ski the race course right after they opened it up to the public. But even he (and I) had a hard time keeping up with Energizer Bunny Dave on his snowboard when we met up at the end of the day and skied all the way down from the top of Cornice with Soo and Kenny.

New Equipment Manager **Bob Hayes** busted out his monoboard for a number of runs, including the face of chair three, a steep black diamond run with snow that was quite firm. Video evidence from Dave shows that he definitely doesn't look as comfortable on it as he does on regular skis.

Saturday the weather started out a bit cloudy but a storm was on the way. Soo, Jay, Bob, Dave and Marilyn skied with Matthew who was going to try four-tracking with the snow slider.

He had some boot fit issues in the morning and they ended up borrowing a bi-ski for the afternoon to get him some runs on the slopes.

Chelsea skied with Kenny, Dean and Glenn. She had a screw loose – on her outrigger – which eventually fell out and while they were able to MacGyver something up on the slopes, later at lunchtime I was able to find a spare pin clip to fix it.

Matt, Ann, Roy and I took Sean out to the Discovery chair where he was eager to re-affirm the title of "Big Air Sean" on the terrain park jumps. He even loaned me his phone so I could take video of him. Later he wanted to try a more challenging run so we went up chair 6 (Unbound) where I used the tethers for his blue run.

Saturday evening dinner featured lots of food, conversation and laughter. In addition to the salad, lasagna and chicken (and non-burned bread), we had cheese tortellini as a vegetarian option. We were able to show videos off of many of our cameras. Sean was a great sport about having his crash replayed - again and again! While he owns "Big Air Sean" he wasn't quite ready to become "Really Big Air Sean" and bailed from a second jump when he had a bit too much speed after the first jump. Good that his ego was the only thing that got a little bruised.

A few inches of snow fell overnight so we were greeted to a white morning on Sunday. Conditions were still snowy and windy. Sean decided that he wanted to try the bi-ski so Jay bucket assisted him. I did a couple runs with Sean as well which was good for me to get some practice.

Soo took Matthew out on the bi-ski and Dave was able to get some

video. We all finished up and got our students back to Main Lodge by around noon. It was still snowing some, and Bob went back to town and was able to help make sure Sean wasn't stuck in the condo parking lot. Dean, Kenny, Dave, Soo and I headed back out to the slopes in the afternoon and found some fun tree runs off of Chair 4 and checked out the avalanche chutes off Chair 22. Clouds were rolling in and out and it was a bit tough to time it so that we would have better visibility on the ski runs, but we managed.

On the drive home Sunday night there were several miles along US 395 where it was snowing, at times pretty hard. It was good that it was not accumulating too much, but the snow flakes and clumps in the headlights made it look like we were doing "warp speed".

The February trip was big, with 26 attendees and 4 club condos. Kenny and I couldn't make it, so this recap is what I remember from talking to Julio. Mike provided some info too. Snow conditions were not as bad as Julio feared given the lack of recent snow and warmer daytime temperatures. Apparently the snow at the top was was pretty firm on Friday and when Dave lost his edge he fell and slid. He tried to avoid some rocks and put his arm out but it caught and he ended up injuring his bicep. He was able to continue riding and volunteering for the weekend.

Saturday was clear and sunny. Students were Chelsea Faulkner, Jason Julian, Sean Sorenburger, Dr. Bob (in his new Wild Ride) and new student Lenna Faggen. The McCarthy's made the trip as did Hannah Nishimoto and

Dr. Bob sat out Sunday morning which gave Lenna a chance to experience Mike and the bi-ski. From what Mike told me, she scared him into taking her on some high speed runs... She must have enjoyed it (either the run or being able to control Mike, or both) because she asked to come back again in April!

Unfortunately, Dave found out after the trip that he had a "full thickness tear" of his bicep and underwent surgery to repair it, so while we managed to shake the injury monkey off our back in January, it came back.

Valle Nevado resort is located just 90 minutes east of Santiago, Chile on 1,999 acres of terrain, with 34 trails. It is known for its spectacular views of the Andes Mountains, dry snow, and wide-open terrain. It traditionally has a deeper and better snow quality than any of the resorts in Chile due to its high altitude (elevation 10,000'), southern orientation, and extensive snowmaking system. We will be staying at the Hotel Puerto Del Sol which is just 20 meters away from the slopes.
