

PIONEER RESIDENT DIES FROM PARALYTIC STROKE

Was Prominent Cattle Buyer
Here Years Ago; Known By
Many Throughout County.

Charles Dibb, pioneer resident of Huron county, died at his home here Tuesday, January 6.

Mr. Dibb died as the result of a stroke on Monday, while returning from the farm of Mr. Smith east of the village. The aged man was walking through the field near the beet station, east and north of the village when he was suddenly stricken. He was found by a party of hunters late in the evening and was unconscious. He was taken to his home by his son, M. R., where he died the next day.

The deceased was born in Belmont, Ont., June 9, 1855, where he grew to young manhood. He came to Michigan in 1881, where he has since resided. He was united in marriage September 12, 1883, to Barbara Jeffrey of Dorchester, Ont., who survives him. To this union was born three children, Mrs. Wm. J. Taylor of Detroit, Milton Dibbs of Elkton, and Violet L. Dibbs, who died in infancy. There are also three grandchildren, Helen, Thelma and Earl R. Dibb.

The bereaved family have the sympathy of the entire community in their hour of sorrow.
