# MINUTES OF REGULAR SESSION OF COUNCIL November 10, 2020

Regular session of Borough Council convened at 7:30 pm. Present were Councilors Tim Sloss, Mike Matlos, Janice Matyasovsky, Jennifer Riley-McClelland, Christopher Gretz, Elizabeth Lape, and Michael Zrenchak, Mayor Larry Sikorski, Solicitor

## **PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

Vicki Underwood – 207 Southern Avenue – Wanted an update on the alley between D & E Streets. Mr. Zrenchak stated that he, Mr. Glenn, Mr. Sloss and Mr. Matlos met with her and her husband to look at the alley. Mr. Glenn's report shows that there are some drainage issues there that will need to be addressed. What we are looking at are the drainage issues and also to tie into the storm line the continues down on Roberts. The total cost to do the project – paving and all the storm work – is \$104,145.00. It is more than just paving it. There are a couple of other options to control dust – the spread of rock salt, you can use oil but that is not DEP approved. There are a couple grant programs out there. One is called the Low Volume Road Program. Mr. Zrenchak said that we will continue to work on it and see what we can come up with.

Rodney Naccarato - 823 Elizabeth Street - He was at the meeting in March regarding the borough digging up his property which caused some issues with mud slide. Mr. Zrenchak said he has taken a look at some things. Pointing at a map – Mr. Zrenchak showed where his property is and that there is a right of way through the bottom of that property that is owned by Bell Telephone. The borough owns a big wedge that goes along the other side of that property. There is a portion of borough property where his pins are that they are allowed to dig in. Mr. Zrenchak was there taking pictures and noticed that someone is dumping lawn and household debris there. Mr. Naccarato stated that he had work done on his home and he put dirt and rocks there but on his property. Mr. Zrenchak stated that there are downspouts that come to the edge of that hillside and that in contributing to the erosion. Mr. Naccarato said that he had no problems until his property was dug through by the borough. He said that if they dig closer than 3 feet to a property line, you are supposed to put up a retaining wall. He said that the borough dug the toe away from his yard and he has lost 3 feet of his yard over the last few years. It was dug through just a month and a half ago. Mr. Zrenchak said that they dug on the other side of the property stake. Mr. Zrenchak said again that there is a right of way through there. The debris that has been dumped over that hillside is falling and clogging that drain and if the borough does not keep that drain clear, there will be flooding instances on Scene Ridge Extension, the fire department ect. The drain line through there is very flat. The survey Mr. Naccarato gave to Mr. Zrenchak shows the property line further over into the borough property. The google shot is showing the survey pin to be on borough property. He does not have a problem with the digging as long as the borough puts up a retaining wall. Mr. Zrenchak questioned if the retaining wall that is already there was legal because it is made out of tires. Mr. Naccarato said that he did not know it was there until the erosion happened. Mr. Zrenchak said that he is aware of them keeping the trench open but not of them digging the hillside. Mr. Naccarato said that he is worried he will lose his garage next.
