Little Village Teams Up With Kidcents !

- Click the box on the right to Enroll in wellness+ with Plenti
- Complete registration process for wellness+ with Plenti
- Click through to finish signing up in Plenti. When finished with both processes, you will be directed to RiteAid.com


2. Enroll in the KidCents Round-Up Program

Alumni student Abby Frazer recently made her first Communion. Instead of party

favors she wanted to make a donation to Little Village.

Abby attended Little Village in 2011 and 2012 in Ms. Trish's class. Before attending Little Village Abby had trouble managing sensory issues as well as impulsive behaviors. Her previous experiences in schools did not go well and Abby didn't like going to school. Ms. Trish and Little Village changed all of that. As Abby explains, "Ms. Trish has always believed in me. That makes me feel good". She learned to love school and embrace who she was as an individual. Along with Ms. Trish and several of her therapists, Abby made signifi-

cant improvements both academically and socially.

After Little Village, Abby returned to Wantagh for Kindergarten where she had a successful year. She was declassified at the end of kindergarten but has continued to work with the school psychologist for a Social Skills group as well as individual sessions on an as needed basis. This past year Abby applied to and was accepted to Friends Academy, a prestigious independent school that focuses on the student to create experiential learning opportunities. Being accepted at Friends was quite an accomplishment for Abby and she will be attending starting in September. Shortly after opening the acceptance letter, she asked her mom to text Ms. Trish to tell her the great news.

When Abby made her communion this April, while looking for favors she asked how much she could spend. After her mom gave her a dollar range, Abby asked, "mom, what if we just take that money and give it to Little Village to thank them for changing my life". Her mom was "blown away that my 8 year old daughter not only knew, but could voice, the fact that Little Village had such an impact on her. As I wiped tears I told her we could absolutely do that." At her communion party she got up in front of 100 guests and explained why there were no favors. She told them about Little Village, Ms. Trish and her other teachers. She told them how the school had changed her life and helped her believe in herself. It was a beautiful moment for the Fraser family and their guests.

We are so proud of Abby and wish her continued success in school. Abby, thank you so much your kindness and generosity and growing into the amazing young woman!


The students in room 62 along with teacher Regina Brennan, have been hard at work in the Little Village garden growing plants and vegetables and having a great time!
