Executive Summary

Human and veterinary Researchers from pulmonary and oncologic medicine will participate in a 3-day workshop to advance collaborations between researchers to facilitate the development of a cohesive plan for novel crossover research efforts in pulmonary fibrosis (PF) and cancer. The meeting will address pathobiology of fibrosing lung disorders and the relationship to common and uncommon cancers.

Goals

The goal of this three-day scientific workshop is to facilitate the advancement of research efforts, leading to improvement of patients' lives who suffer from pulmonary fibrosis (PF) and cancer, PF patients who are at risk for cancer as well as cancer survivors who have or are at risk for pulmonary fibrosis.

Bringing together physicians, research experts, pathologists, patient advocates, representatives of private foundations, industry and biotechnology, and federal scientific organizations from human and veterinary medicine to a workshop designed to advance knowledge in the area of lung fibrosis and its connection to cancer. The ultimate goal would be to prevent fibrosis and related cancers in people and animals, and develop effective therapies for those affected by or at risk for the combined disorders.
