Blood Donations Still Needed

There is no known end date in the fight against COVID-19 and the Red Cross needs the help of blood and platelet donors to maintain a sufficient blood supply for weeks to come. The top priority of the Red Cross is the safety of donors, volunteers, employees and blood recipients, and are committed to transparency with the American public during this evolving public health emergency. There is no known data or evidence that COVID-19 can be transmissible by blood transfusion. Donating blood products is essential to community health and eligible donors are strongly urged to donate blood, platelets, or AB Elite plasma. The Red Cross only collects blood from individuals who are healthy and feeling well at the time of donation, and who meet other eligibility requirements. To support social distancing, appointments are now required. Economic Impact Payments for Individuals and Families

The IRS started distributing economic impact payments this week. Most people will get their payments automatically and will not need to take any action. Social Security beneficiaries who are not typically required to file tax returns will not need to file to receive a payment. Instead, payments will be automatically deposited into their bank accounts. **Please do not call the IRS about this.** The IRS is committed to distributing Economic Impact Payment as soon as possible. The payments, also referred to by some as stimulus payments, are automatic for most taxpayers. No further action is needed by taxpayers who filed tax returns in 2018 and 2019 and most seniors and retirees. To check if you are eligible, check your payment status, or if you don't file taxes and need to fill out an application, please visit www.irs.gov.

Schools Closed for 2019-2020 School Year

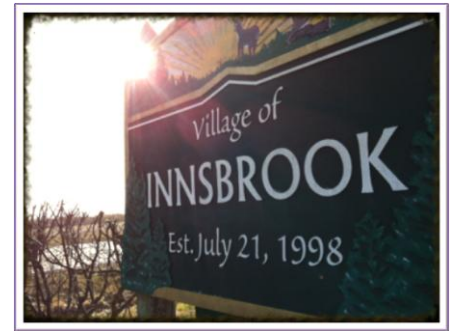
Missouri schools will remain closed through this academic school year. The Missouri Department of Elementary & Secondary Education (DESE), along with several school superintendents from across the state, made the recommendation to Governor Parson on April 9. The recommendation was not made lightly. However, the decision was made to continue protecting the health and safety of the students and school staff members. School buildings will remain closed for the rest of the school year, but school services should continue through the last day of school in each school district, as pre-established by the school calendar approved by their local board of education. Those continued services include providing much-needed meals to the students who count on them, as well as alternative educational opportunities. With the closing of schools many questions still remain. Some answers can be found at dese.mo.gov, others will be answered at a later time.
