Benefits

OSHA shipyard standards require that employers either establish a shipyard rescue team or arrange for an outside rescue team which will respond promptly to a request for rescue service for confined and enclosed spaces (29 CFR 1915 Subpart B). This course is designed to provide training needed by the shipyard team to use the personal protective equipment he or she will need, including respirators and any rescue equipment necessary for making rescues from confined and enclosed spaces and other dangerous atmospheres. Each employee assigned to the shipyard rescue team will be trained through hands-on drills to perform his or her rescue functions including confined and enclosed and other dangerous atmosphere entry.

Who Should Attend

Shipyard rescue team members, emergency medical personnel, firefighters, safety professionals, police officers, and anyone involved in confined and enclosed space rescue on vessels.
