The Assumption of Saint Mary: A Light for Today's Mothers

On August 15, the Church joyfully remembers the Assumption of the Holy Mother of God, Saint Mary, when, at the end of her earthly life, she was taken body and soul into heavenly glory. This feast is not only a celebration of Mary's unique holiness and closeness to Christ, but also a beacon of hope and purpose for all faithful, especially for mothers today, who quietly and courageously walk in Mary's footsteps.

Saint Mary: A Life of Silent Strength

Saint Mary's life was not one of grandeur or comfort. She bore the Son of God, not in a palace but in a stable. She lived a simple and humble life, marked by quiet obedience, service, and deep trust in God. She experienced sorrow, uncertainty, and pain, especially as she witnessed the suffering of her beloved Son. Yet through it all, she remained faithful, pondering God's will in her heart, accepting it with humility and grace.

The Assumption is God's response to her faithfulness. Her body, the vessel that bore the Savior, was not left to decay. She was taken into Heaven, not by her own power, but by the power and love of God. It is a promise of what awaits all who live in faith, especially those who offer their lives for others.

The Feast in the Armenian Church

In the Armenian Apostolic Church, the Assumption of the Holy Mother of God is one of the five major feasts, a day rich with deep meaning and sacred beauty. While the Western Church observes the Assumption on August 15, the Armenian Church celebrates it on the nearest Sunday to August 15, allowing the faithful to gather in full to honor the Theotokos.

On this sacred day, we also observe the Blessing of the Grapes, a tradition unique to the Armenian Church. It is more than a custom, it is a symbol of spiritual offering and thanksgiving.

The Blessing of the Grapes

Grapes are the first fruits of the harvest in the Armenian highlands and among the most valued crops. In ancient times, these first fruits were offered to God in gratitude before any were consumed. In the Christian context, grapes also carry a deep Eucharistic meaning: they remind us of Christ, who said, "I am the vine, you are the branches" (John 15:5), and whose Blood is represented through wine in the Holy Communion.

The blessing of grapes on the Feast of the Assumption reflects both of these themes:

- Thanksgiving for the physical and spiritual blessings God has given.
- Dedication of the first and best of our lives to the Lord.
- And the honoring of the Holy Mother of God, who offered the first and most precious fruit of all, Jesus Christ, the Son of God. (Continued on the back page)



By blessing and sharing grapes, the Church invites us to reflect on what we offer to God, not just fruit, but our time, talents, families, and faith.

A Reflection for Today's Mothers

Today's mothers, like Mary, live lives full of sacrifice and quiet strength. Whether raising children, working jobs, caring for families, or supporting communities, they often go unseen, their exhaustion unnoticed, their love assumed. But just as God saw Mary's faithfulness in silence, He sees every act of love mothers offer in the hidden corners of life.

Saint Mary's life exemplifies humility, unwavering faith, and steadfast love. In a world often driven by quick results and visible success, Mary's quiet strength reminds us that true greatness is found in patience, trust, and faithful perseverance. Her courage to say "yes" to God's plan, without knowing all the details, shows a profound surrender and hope that resonates deeply with the challenges faced by mothers today.

Just as Mary carried her mission with grace amid hardship and uncertainty, modern mothers embody that same resilience and devotion in their daily lives. They nurture, protect, and sacrifice often without recognition, reflecting Mary's gentle yet powerful presence. Her example invites all of us to honor the hidden, faithful love that shapes families and communities quietly but profoundly.

A mother helping her child with homework late at night, comforting them in illness, or praying silently for her family, these moments echo Mary's tenderness. And in each of these moments, a mother is living her own "fiat," her own yes to God's plan, even without knowing the full picture.

One day years ago, in a small village, a woman named Mariam raised four children alone after her husband's passing. Her home was poor, her body often tired, but her heart was full of faith. She lit candles each morning and whispered prayers each night. She taught her children kindness, respect, and prayer, not with many words, but with how she lived. Today, her grandchildren are serving others across the world, teachers, nurses, and church servants, rooted in the quiet holiness they saw in their grandmother's life.

This is what Mary's Assumption teaches us: God honors those who live with humility and faith. He lifts up the lowly. He remembers the quiet workers in His vineyard.

May the Feast of the Assumption and the Blessing of the Grapes fill your home and heart with joy and may the Holy Mother of God intercede for all mothers, guiding them in love, patience, and quiet holiness, until we, too, are lifted toward heaven.
