### "Another 500th Year Anniversary"

"So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls."

Acts 2:41

Earlier this year I pointed out that 2025 marks the five hundredth anniversary of a very significant event in church history, the formulation of the Nicene Creed, which was a summary of basic Christian doctrine. At the Council of Nicea held in western Asia Minor representatives of the church from throughout the Roman Empire came to agreement about the deity and humanity of Jesus Christ.

A few months earlier another event transpired which has relevance to us Christians who call ourselves Baptists. Prior to 200 AD there is no evidence that Christians practiced infant baptism. But after that year it became common such that by the 1500s the Church required its members to baptize their young children. In the early 1500s Martin Luther led a movement that became known as the Protestant Reformation. These reformers stressed that salvation came through faith alone in Jesus. They objected to many other teachings and practices of the Catholic Church.

These Protestants, however, continued to practice infant baptism. One of these Reformers was Ulrich Zwingli who came to dominate the religious and political scene in Zurich, Switzerland. Georg Blaurock was a Catholic priest who was brought to faith in Jesus through the preaching of Ulrich Zwingli. He became involved in a Bible study with Felix Manz and Conrad Grebel. As a result of their Bible study they became convinced that Christian baptism should be done by immersion only after genuine belief in Jesus.

So on January 21, 1525, Georg Blaurock asked Conrad Grebel to baptize him. He did. Then Blaurock baptized all of the other adults who were present. They became known as "Anabaptists," based upon the little Greek word "ana," which means "again."

Unfortunately this did not go over well with the political and religious leaders of Zurich. Two weeks after this baptism service 25 of the participants were arrested. In 1527 Felix Manz was drowned by these other Christians. Georg Blaurock escaped Europe and had a fruitful ministry in other parts of Europe. But in 1529 the Catholics got him and had him burned at the stake.

One of the places where Anabaptism took root was in the Netherlands. Menno Simons was a Catholic priest who became disillusioned with the church's teaching and came under the influence of the Reformers. He came to believe that the Anabaptists were right about baptism. The strain of Anabaptists who trace their roots to him became known for their nonviolence. The Mennonites and Amish have a spiritual connection to him.

We Baptists may not claim the pacifist connection, but we can appreciate the Anabaptist connection in this five hundredth anniversary year.




### **CHURCH HIKE**
