## Deaths Decline to 1992 Levels

Latest Preliminary 2002 Pa. Death Statistics show Death Rate Declines back to 1992 levels - Death Rate falls most noticeably in counties in a manner that couldn't be predicted. See the attached data that shows declining death rate for 2000 to 2002. Did US Army under Clinton attack Republican and Democrat Penna. Counties? Pennsylvania surely did safeguard the Constitution. Note: Not since 1968 (Vietnam War) had the "Crude Death Rate" (deaths per 1000 population) been as high as in 1999 during Clinton's term. 

Dear Mr. Langford:

I stopped by the Medical Center on Friday, but since it was late, you, according to an exiting guard probably weren't available for questions.

Since your facility is huge, a half mile by half mile or so, I DID THINK IT WAS STRANGE THE DOORS WERE LOCKED (TWO SETS) WHEN I TRIED TO ACCESS FROM THE MAIN PARKING LOT. DON'T THE PRISONERS HAVE ANY VISITORS OR DO YOU HAVE ANY PRISONERS YET? The prison has been there four years or so and yet it isn't listed on the main Devens Industrial Park map.

To get to the point, I have some questions which should be available under the Freedom of Information Act. These questions are vital to our readers health and safety and your cooperation would be appreciated.

- 1. Reports of Devens Medical Center being built reached Pennsylvania with the information that it was being constructed for political prisoners. Of course this was being done during President Clinton's term. Is it as rumored and as appearances suggest, a concentration camp or worse, an extermination camp? The two million deer hunters in Pa. want to know.
- 2. Why didn't they hire any former Ft. Devens guards who were being laid off? Did they screen the guards they hired for a particular type person? What kind of tests do you take to become a guard there?
- 3. Devens is pictured and mentioned in a concentration camp web site along with many other locations in the USA. Is there a network of concentration camps built in the USA during the Clinton years? An army major who witnessed these camps said, "why build them if not to use them?".
- 4. A former US Army employee who I interviewed and who drove around inside of the Medical Center during construction, claims it is a concentration camp. Can a brief tour be arranged to prove or disprove his allegations?
- 5. An interview published on the Web with a construction worker while Devens was being built said it was a camp for political prisoners. A tour can confirm or expose this as a fabrication.
- 6. Medical Centers were used in the USSR for political prisoners whom they labeled as insane. China uses prisoners to export body parts overseas. Obviously a medical center could be used to administer truth serum, etc. to find out where political prisoners hide their financial assets, etc. Do any or all of these uses apply to your Medical Center?
- 7. I have video and pictures of the medical center in the building stages. Of particular concern is the industrial style smoke stacks pictured in one of the photos. Are these stacks for a crematorium? I need to inspect them for mechanical means of feeding dead bodies to be incinerated like the Nazi's had at their bigger camps.
- 8. Since this Medical Center was built on Federal property, no local building permits were needed. However, I would like to see the plans to judge whether this is a concentration camp or a normal prison. I want a tour to confirm the plans.
- 9. Joe Kennedy supported Hitler to a degree, is that why this prison/medical center is built in Mass.? Sincerely yours,
