

Pastor's Paragraphs

"Behold, I will create new heavens and a new earth. The former things will not be remembered nor will they come to mind. But be glad and rejoice forever in what I will create, for I will create Jerusalem to be a delight and its people a joy. I will rejoice over Jerusalem and take delight in my people" (Isaiah 65:17-19).

January 1, 2018 – the beginning of a New Year. Will you make New Year's resolutions? How often have you been able to keep your resolutions in past years? I've never been good at keeping my resolutions so now I resolve <u>not</u> to make New Year's resolutions?

Yet the New Year is an opportunity to make a new beginning. One of the great gifts we have as followers of Jesus is that we can start anew every day. We are given second chances, again and again. Through the grace of God we always have the opportunity to be made new.

How do you need to be made new? Are their mistakes in your life that you regret? What in your past haunts you and keeps you awake at night? What sins have you committed that make you feel guilty? In what ways have you experienced brokenness,

experiences that have left you scarred and shaken, that keep you from living in joy and peace? In Christ all of that is gone. "The old has passed away." Through Christ you are a new creation. You get a second chance.

This is true for us as individuals. It is also true for the church. Puckety Church has the opportunity to be made new. This doesn't mean that we forget the past. We need to learn from it, but we are not controlled or defined by what has happened in the past. As we start a New Year we have the opportunity to be begin anew. As Puckety begins a new chapter in its life and ministry this is a message of hope.

The problem with New Year's resolutions is that we have to work so hard to make them a reality. It depends on *our* efforts, *our* sacrifices, *our* work, *our* abilities. The truth is, if we were able to make those changes we probably would have already made them. The good news is that becoming a new creation does not rely on our efforts or abilities. It is God's work in us. "I will create a new heaven and a new earth... I will create Jerusalem to be a delight and its people a joy." "I am making everything new." God is doing what we can't do.

Our job is to put ourselves in circumstances that make it most likely that God will work in our lives – attending worship as often as we can, praying and reading God's Word, forgiving those who have hurt us (or confessing our own faults), serving in whatever ways we are called, obeying what we know to be true, loving those around us, etc. What needs to happen in your life so that you will most likely be able to experience God's work in your life? What needs to happen at Puckety so that we might become new?

As we move into the New Year rejoice and celebrate the good news that God makes all things new. "Everyone who is in Christ is a new creation. The old has passed away; see, everything has become new" (2 Corinthians 5:17)!

Worship Team - Sue Close - The Worship Team, along with the pastor, oversees the worship at Puckety.


Please be sure to check the bulletin board outside the church office any time you are visiting the church. It is full of useful information and announcements from throughout the community!



Minutes of the Puckety Presbyterian Church Deacons Meeting Wednesday, November 1, 2017

Denise opened the meeting with prayer. Our balance as of 10/31/2017 is \$3,716.85.

We had 12 requests for help. We were able to help 9 with rent, food and love gifts.

We need to increase the amount of communion items for Sunday, November 5th due to it being Kirk Orr's last Sunday.

We discussed progress on our various missions for November and December. These were Operation Christmas Child cost adjustments, Thanksgiving baskets, and the Angel Tree.

This year we have 30 children's names from families we have helped throughout the year for the Angel Tree. Next year we will contact a senior center and see if we can use some of their residents for the Angel Tree.

We approved sending a Christmas card and love gift of \$100 to Try-Life in lieu of diapers. We discussed the yearly Pastor Christmas Love Gift letter. Denise will take charge of creating and making the copies.

Beth will take over keeping mints in the candy baskets. Anyone else is welcome to donate other varieties.

We decided to keep the donation to Our Daily Bread at \$250 this year.

We decided to help pay for a new edition of Media Shout, which is the video program the volunteers use to project the worship service on the screen each week. This will be approximately \$400. John Fisher will be handling the purchase and Sandra will coordinate the purchase with John.

Minutes of the Puckety Presbyterian Church Deacons Meeting

Wednesday, December 6, 2017

Our pastor, Doug Marshall attended the meeting. Denise opened the meeting with prayer. Our balance as of 11/30/2017 is \$2.500.94.

We had 10 requests for help. We were able to help 5 with rent, love gifts and a ride to the doctor's office.

11 Thanksgiving baskets were packed by John, Brenda and Irene. They provided food for 25 adults and 19 children. They were picked up on Saturday November 18th.

28 boxes were donated to Operation Christmas Child/Samaritan's Purse. Irene delivered them to the community drop off at Grace Presbyterian.

We had 30 children's names from families we have helped throughout the year for the Angel Tree. Gifts were placed under the sanctuary Christmas Tree. Denise and Maria will call and coordinate the pick up of the gifts on the same day as the Christmas food baskets.

Christmas baskets will be prepared and ready for pick up on Saturday December 16^{th} between 9:30-10:30 am. Lori brought up the issue of having too many regular print Our Daily Bread devotionals left at the end of November. It was recommended that in order to be good stewards we reduce the quarterly request from 225 to 150 copies.

The deacons were presented with a request for a man who had his electricity shut off for the last year and had his sewage shut off. Further discussion involved his age, job, life situation and mental capability. It was decided that his situation required more serious help than what we could currently provide. We are consulting with the person who submitted his name about possibly referring him to Westmoreland Case management and Supports, Inc. (WCSI).

Denise gave us a floor plan of the church building and a brief presentation on emergency evacuation routes and procedures when in the church building. She also presented recommendations for safety during an active shooter scenario.

Denise has challenged us to find all the fire extinguishers and their locations in the church buildings and if there are any evacuation plans posted. There will be a prize.

RECOMMENDATION TO SESSION: Please discuss having an evacuation plan and a pull down fire alarm that rings throughout the church building.

Stories of Redstone Christ at work in our midst LOGOS, a midweek ministry for children and youth, is based on Acts 2:42, which tells of the disciples gathering for

children and youth, is based on Acts 2:42, which tells of the disciples gathering for fellowship, study, worship, and sharing a meal. Their mission is simple: intergenerational ministry so that the next generation will catch the faith and know that we are ALL children of God, and that we ALL deserve to be treated that way.

To learn more about the ministry, Delmont Presbyterian Church welcomed two trainers from GenOn Ministry, the organization that sponsors the ministry and supports churches who want to implement it in their own unique settings.



As part of the LOGOS Encounter, we experienced LOGOS. We shared a family meal, with a Pirates theme and table games. We enjoyed recreation that wasn't based on having winners and losers. We studied the Bible interactively, and we learned worship skills.

LOGOS is like jazz: there are a few very basic things that are crucial for success, and then each congregation adapts the program for their needs. Got just a few high school students and a few lower-elementary age children with nothing inbetween? The trainers had ideas for ways to make it work. Want to use it as a Sunday School option? That can work. Lots of children and youth in your congregation? This ministry can strengthen relationships and bring even more growth.
