Brown A: cut two 5 1/4 inch squares, cut diagonally twice
 B: cut two 4 7/8 inch squares, cut in half diagonally



Polka dots C: cut one 4 1/2 inch square
 D: cut four 3 1/4 x 6 inch rectangles

Sew 4 A's to all sides of C; sew 2 B's to side of 2 D's
 Sew 2 A's to ends of 2 D's; sew 2 B's to one side of the 2 ADA sections
 Sew rows together to make block!

The meeting was called to order by President Dani Neuman at 10:00 AM.

The pledge of allegiance was recited.

There were no additional candidates from the floor, so an oral vote was taken, and the slate of officers as listed above was approved.

Dani thanked the nominating committee members for their work.

Dani stated that the current website director, Lindsay Hellman, is finishing out her current term through the end of this year. A replacement needs to be found. Guild member Gabriel Gutierrez volunteered to assume this position.

The birthdays for this month were announced -including the program speaker - and mug mugs were distributed to those members present at the meeting.

Mary Jo Kent, secretary, stated that the minutes from last month's meeting had been published in the newsletter; there being no additions or corrections, they were considered approved as published.

Ellen Wulf, treasurer, reported the bank balance as \$

Margret Gaeddert, VP, announced the speaker for this month's program as Karen Balar.

November's speaker will be Laura Lee Price.

Maggie Walker, membership, stated that there were 53 attendees at the meeting, which included 5 guests, and one new member.

Kay O' Neill, welcoming chair, had no update.

Newsletter - members need to submit any items by the 26th of the month.

Linda Feutz, BOM, commented on the numerous Halloween-theme blocks submitted this month - one winner's name was drawn. The block for next month was on display; instructions were available at the meeting, and will be published in the newsletter. Some previous month's blocks were available if there was any interest from the winner.

Linda also drew the winner for fir quarters.

Four prize drawings winning tickets were pulled.

Patti Glenn, communications, had no update.

Carol Holmes, historian, pointed out the two guild scrapbooks she had brought to the meeting for viewing, one of these books is dedicated to the most recent Fair and Country Fair activities and exhibits. There are also photos of show and tell quilts available for members to take home.

Peggy Hart, Opportunity Quilt, had no update other than to remind members to turn in their ticket sale proceeds, as the drawing is scheduled to be held at the December meeting.

Rose Luce, quilts to share, commented on the attendance at the quilt to share workshop held in September - a lot of work was accomplished. Quilts for members to finish are available at the meeting entrance.

Rose acknowledged the efforts of Trudy Molina and Linda Wagner in shipping quilts to the Maui fire relief.

Rose Luce, fair liaison, reported that the guild received a fee of \$4000 for the efforts expended to manage the Chardonnay Expo hall. This was supplemental to the proceeds from Opportunity Quilt ticket sales, mugs/baskets, and the quilts' boutique sales.

Next year, the guild will need to provide more coordination and volunteering than in the past two years, as Rose's position as Fair liaison has been expanded.

Rose received a round of applause for her work as Fair liaison.

There were no updates from sunshine, parliamentarian, website, nor hospitality chairs.

The following announcements were made:

Ann Scorsello has an exhibit of some of her quilts in the hall of the Senior Center which she invited members to view.

Linda Feutz, Art in the Library, commented on the change in the library policy which dictates a three-year gap between exhibition and application for future exhibition. She has sent an email about this to the library without receiving any feedback. She will send library contact info to Patti Glenn for publication so that members can write to the library to protest this new policy.

Dani Neuman announced a ten minute break to be followed by show and tell, and today's speaker presentation.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:44 AM.
