preciated.


A committee has been formed and has met once to discuss SIGP giving an award to a local High School girl for some type of an enrichment program. Details are still being discussed.

SIGP participated in our first ever Dream It Be It program. We collaborated with Arts Academy in the Woods High School in Fraser. In total seven girls participated in this three week after school program held on April 20th, 27th, and May 4th. Interested Soroptimist volunteers were trained using the SIA DIBI curriculum. This curriculum focused on goal setting, overcoming obstacles and en-

visioning future careers. The students actively participated in small group discussions, fun ice breaker activities, and curriculum worksheets narrowing their career and goal focus. I think SI members learned just as much from the girls as they did from us. We concluded the third week session providing all the girls with volunteer contact information to continue our mentoring relationships. After completion of the program,

girls shared their thoughts about their experience. One participate said, "I created a network of people who can help me achieve my goals." Another stated, "I learned to set goals for myself." Even one of the Soroptimist volunteers stated, "I wish I had this [program] at 14 or 15 years old."


The Historic Indian Village Home and Garden Tour Committee is pleased to once again host a TWO DAY tour in celebration of the successful restoration of its historic street-light system.




