William Donald Benkelman, 73, of Cass City died Tuesday, Aug. 6, 2002, at his home in Cass City. He was born Oct. 23, 1928, in Royal Oak to Harold and Isabel (Fletcher) Benkelman. He married Barbara Ell of New York on May 2, 1952, in East Lansing. She preceded him in death Feb. 1, 1995. Bill attended Michigan State College of Agriculture and Applied Science, now Michigan State University, where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1952.
