

Parish Membership: Every family and single adult to be considered active members of St. Bartholomew's Parish must be properly registered in the parish, receiving and regularly using the parish weekly donation envelopes. Only in this way can the parish issue documents attesting to parish membership and Catholic practice, e.g. a letter to be a Godparent or Sponsor. New parishioners are requested to visit the parish office.

Sick & Shut-ins: The priests are available to administer the Sacraments to those who are unable to come to Church. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is part of the healing ministry of the Church, and should be received early in an illness or before a serious operation.

Baptisms: Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

Marriages: In order to provide sufficient time for the Marriage Preparation Course, please call the parish office and ask to speak with the pastor at least six months in advance of the wedding.

Parish Council: Meets on Wednesday evening quarterly.

Holy Name Society: Meets on the Monday evening after the second Sunday of the month. President, Joseph Chimenti

Preparing the Way of the Lord

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist appears as a bold



messenger in the wilderness, crying out, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." His words are not a warning of doom, but an invitation. Repentance is not just about turning away from sin; it's about

turning toward the One who is coming, the Savior who is about to bring peace to the world.

Isaiah gives us a vision of the Messiah—one who will bring justice, righteousness, and harmony to all creation. "The wolf shall dwell with the lamb," he prophesies. This is not just a vision for the world at the end of time; it is the world we are called to prepare for now, in our hearts and in our communities. Jesus comes to make all things new, and we are invited to join in that work of renewal.

Let us pray for the grace to prepare our hearts, to make them fertile ground for the coming of Christ, so that we may bear the fruit of peace, justice, and love in a world that longs for the light of Christ.






THE NORMAL HOURS FOR THE PARISH OFFICE ARE AS FOLLOWS: Monday, Wednesday, and Friday

RESULTS - ST BART'S BLOOD DRIVE - NOVEMBER 28, 2025

St. Bart's and New York Blood Center express sincere appreciation to the 49 donors who came down to the 112th Blood Drive on 11/28/25

to donate 48 units. Since 1981, St Bart's blood drives have collected 8222 units of blood.

Once again, NYBC can depend on St. Bart's friends and parishioners to understand the need for blood, particularly during critical

times of shortage. 36 donors gave a regular donation. 6 donors

gave double red cell donations using the ALYX system. 7 donors were deferred for various reasons. There were 10 new donors and 14 walk-ins.

27 prospective donors had signed up but were not able to attend.
